

MINUTES OF A MEETING
OF THE
STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION *****

Held in the Water Commission Office, Thursday, April 9, 1942.

The regular meeting of the State Water Conservation Commission was called to order at 9:40 A.M., Thursday, April 9, 1942, in the office of the Commission. Roll was called with Vice-Chairman Holt, Commissioners Thompson, Simons and Dahl present. Governor Moses absent. Because of the absence of Governor Moses, Vice-Chairman Holt presided.

Minutes of the last meeting of the Commission, held in Bismarck on February 6th and 7th, 1942, having been sent to each Commissioner, and no errors being noted, it was moved by Commissioner Thompson and seconded by Commissioner Dahl, that the minutes of the meeting be approved. The motion carried, all Commissioners voting aye.

Financial Reports were given each Commissioner. Mr. Tom Dohn, Bookkeeper was called into the meeting to explain certain items on two of the reports, and was requested to make certain changes in setting up future reports. Mr. Dohn left the meeting. It was moved by Commissioner Dahl and seconded by Commissioner Simons that the financial reports be approved and placed on file. The motion carried, all Commissioners voting aye. Copies of same enclosed herewith.

Members of the Commission requested that the Secretary write "thank you" letters to the following organizations: Mr. Orlady and the American Legion; Greater North Dakota Association; North Dakota Reclamation Association; Valley City Winter Show officials; LeHigh Briquet Company; various Chambers of Commerce throughout the State. The Secretary was requested to take proper action on the resolution received from the Bowbells Junior Association of Commerce on April 8, 1942. It was also agreed that a letter of appreciation be written to Mr. Ray A. H. Brandt of Minot for his efforts in behalf of irrigation, and Vice-Chairman Holt suggested that the Secretary enclose in such letter the editorial clipped from the Bismarck Tribune, dated April 8, 1942, for Mr. Brandt's information. Motion was made by Commissioner Simons and seconded by Commissioner Dahl that "thank you" letters be written by the Secretary to various deserving organizations in appreciation of their interest and efforts in behalf of irrigation. The motion carried, all Commissioners voting aye.

There was some discussion regarding construction of pumping projects along the Missouri River by the Bureau of Reclamation. It was suggested that the Secretary show Mr. Charles Hinze of the Bureau of Reclamation, whose headquarters will soon be in the Commission Office at the Capitol Building, a letter written to Mr. Tucker by Mr. Sloan of the Bureau of Reclamation, regarding the various proposed projects.

In regard to the Kyes Project, Commissioner Simons suggested that it would be desirable to attempt to arrange with the County Commissioners of Emmons County to set up a conservancy district, which would be influential in obtaining action from the Farm Security Administration in regard to starting the Kyes Project. Mr. Ben Barrett, County Agent of Emmons County, will back the Commission in this attempt.

Governor Moses came into the meeting at 10:00 A.M.

There was discussion of the coming "contact meetings" sponsored by the North Dakota Reclamation Association for the purpose of promoting the water program. Governor Moses intends to attend the three meetings to be held on April 22nd, at Bowman, New England and Dickinson. Commissioner Dahl expects to attend the meetings to be held at Halliday or Killdeer, and at Hazen on Thursday, April 23rd.

The Commission agreed that the Secretary should have the folders printed and sent out without further delay.

There was considerable discussion regarding the Victory Garden Easement situation. Mr. Kelsch, Attorney General's Office, was called into the meeting. It was arranged to have Mr. August Harke of Bismarck called into the meeting at 1:30 P.M. in an attempt to arrange for completion of the easement.

A motion was made by Commissioner Dahl and seconded by Commissioner Thompson that the Attorney General's office be authorized and directed to institute condemnation proceedings for the purpose of acquiring title to Lot 1, Section 6, Township 138 North, Range 80 West, in Burleigh County North Dakota, consisting of one acre more or less, for the use of the Water Conservation Commission of the State of North Dakota, in constructing, operating and maintaining irrigation structures, unless suitable easement was signed by the end of that week. The Secretary was authorized and directed to negotiate for the signing of this easement, and if same was not done within the allotted time, the Secretary was authorized to notify the Attorney General's Office to start proceedings immediately. Roll was called with Governor Moses, Vice-Chairman Holt, Commissioners Thompson, Simons and Dahl voting aye. Motion carried.

Mr. Kelsch left the meeting.

In regard to Mr. John Sullivan's "North Dakota Water and Reclamation Association", it was agreed that the Water Conservation Commission would take the stand of "friendly cooperation". It was suggested by Vice-Chairman Holt that the Secretary write to Mr. Sullivan and assure him of the Commission's sincere desire to cooperate to the best of their ability, and to send a copy to Mr. Harry Polk and to Mr. L. T. Orlady as such action would be in line with the same type of cooperation that the Commission has with those organizations.

The meeting was recessed at 11:45 A.M.

Vice-Chairman Holt called the meeting to order at approximately 1:35 P.M. Roll was called, with Vice-Chairman Holt, Commissioners Simons, Dahl and Thompson present. Governor Moses absent. Mr. August Harke of Bismarck and Mr. Kelsch of the Attorney General's Office came into the meeting.

Commissioner Simons stated that the matter before the Commission was that of negotiating or attempting to negotiate with Mr. Harke, if possible, for the right-of way for a ditch across Lot 1, Section 6, Township 138 North, Range 80 West, belonging to Mr. Harke. Lengthy discussion was held regarding the easement, which Mr. Harke assured the Commission he would sign, provided certain changes were made in the easement. Mr. Harke, Mr. Kelsch and the Commission agreed upon an easement suitable to all concerned, and Mr. Harke assured the Commission he would sign the finished lease the following day. Mr. Harke further stated that he would sign another easement granting the Water Commission the land directly under the bridge for as long as the Commission wanted it for their pumps, equipment, etc.

Mr. Harke and Mr. Kelsch left the meeting.

The Commission discussed the matter of requesting the W.P.A. to furnish a man to work on the stream flow records for North Dakota, and compile same so as to be readily available for use. A motion was made by Mr. Simons and seconded by Commissioner Dahl that the Secretary be authorized to ask the W.P.A. to assign a man to the stream flow records project in the Commission's office. The motion carried with all Commissioners present voting aye. Governor Moses absent.

Judge Christianson came into the meeting. He gave the Commissioners a complete explanation of the Commission's procedure in turning their interest in the Lewis and Clark Project over to the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District. Judge Christianson turned over to the Water Commission a statement from the Workmen's Compensation Bureau regarding the issuance of bonds for the purpose of refinancing and retiring the \$30,000.00 bond issue dated May 1, 1941 which the Bureau purchased and now holds. Statement attached hereto.

Judge Christianson presented the following resolution for the Commission's adoption, regarding Series "I" bonds. A motion was made by Commissioner Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Simons, that the resolution be adopted by the Commission. Roll was called with Vice-Chairman Holt, Commissioners Simons, Dahl and Thompson voting aye. Governor Moses absent. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the State Water Conservation Commission of North Dakota entered into an agreement with the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District in McKenzie County for the construction by the State Water Conservation Commission of a certain irrigation system for the irrigation of lands within the said District under an arrangement whereby the said Irrigation District was to issue its bonds and the proceeds thereof were to be utilized to pay for such irrigation works and facilities, and

WHEREAS, the State Water Conservation Commission about the same time entered into an arrangement with the North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation whereby the said Corporation agreed to advance to the said Water Conservation Commission from time to time moneys to enable the Commission to proceed with such work, with the understanding that the Commission should either repay in cash the moneys so advanced by the said North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation or deliver to said North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation the bonds of said State Water Conservation Commission secured by an equal amount of the bonds of the said Lewis and Clark Irrigation District, it being further understood that the said North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation might, if it so desired, take and receive with the said bonds of the said State Water Conservation Commission the bonds of the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District held by the Commission as collateral security for the payment of its said bonds, and

WHEREAS, the said Lewis and Clark Irrigation District did thereafter vote two certain issues of bonds, one for \$150,000 of irrigation system bonds and another issue of \$25,000 to defray the cost of necessary drainage construction incident to and an essential part of the irrigation system, and

WHEREAS, final settlement has not been made between the State Water Conservation Commission and the North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation as to the matters involved incident to the advancement of moneys by the corporation to the Commission for the construction of the irrigation system of the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District and the said State Water Conservation Commission has still in its possession the \$150,000 of irrigation bonds issued by the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District with the exception of \$30,000 of such bonds that were pledged by the State Water Conservation Commission as security for a \$30,000 issue of bonds by the said State Water Conservation Commission known as Series "I" in the amount of \$30,000 issued May 1, 1941, and sold to the North Dakota Workmen's Compensation Bureau, and

WHEREAS, it seems desirable to have such \$30,000 issue of bonds re-issued so as to have different maturities than those now carried by the bonds, and

WHEREAS, it further appears to the satisfaction of the Commission that in order to obtain funds to pay for the cost of the construction of the said irrigation system the State Water Conservation Commission finds it necessary to issue the revenue bonds of the said Commission in an additional sum of \$9,000.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the State Water Conservation Commission of the State of North Dakota issue its bonds in the sum of \$39,000, such bonds to be in the denomination of \$1,000 each, dated May 1, 1942, and bearing interest at the rate of 3% per annum, payable annually on May First of each year, with the principal payable as follows:

\$1,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1944
\$1,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1945
\$1,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1946
\$1,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1947
\$1,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1948
\$2,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1949
\$2,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1950
\$2,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1951
\$2,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1952
\$2,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1953
\$3,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1954
\$3,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1955
\$3,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1956
\$3,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1957
\$3,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1958
\$3,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1959
\$3,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1960
\$3,000.00 payable on or before May 1, 1961

And that as security for the payment of such bonds the State Water Conservation Commission irrevocably pledge and hypothecate \$39,000 of irrigation system bonds of the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District. (The said bonds of the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum but it is understood that interest shall be collected only at the rate of 3% per annum and that an appropriate agreement may be made between the State Water Conservation Commission and the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District providing for a reduction of the rate of interest accordingly; also that the said State Water Conservation Commission and the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District may agree to change the date of payment of interest and principal on the bonds of the said Lewis and Clark Irrigation District so as to conform to the interest payments and the payment of principal of the bonds of the State Water Conservation Commission.)

Also that the said State Water Conservation Commission pledge and hypothecate as guarantee for the payment of such bonds, under the provisions of Sub-division 4, Section 21, Chapter 256, Laws 1939, as amended and re-enacted by House Bill No. 167 of the Laws of 1941, the sum of \$7,800 in cash. That such bonds and such moneys be deposited with the Bank of North Dakota as trustee under a Trust Agreement with authority to the Trustee to invest the moneys so deposited with it in appropriate securities to be approved by the State Industrial Commission. Also that the Chairman and Secretary of the State Water Conservation Commission be authorized to take all steps necessary to carry this resolution into effect and to that end to execute for and on behalf of the Commission such instruments as may be necessary, including the Trust Agreement, and to execute and deliver the bonds of the Commission as heretofore set forth.

AND WHEREAS, the North Dakota Workmen's Compensation Bureau has offered to purchase said \$39,000 of I-B series at par.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED that said offer be and the same is accepted and the Chairman and Secretary of the State Water Conservation Commission are authorized to issue and deliver the said bonds to the said North Dakota Workmen's Compensation Bureau, it being understood that the proceeds of said \$39,000 issue of I-B bonds shall be utilized first to pay off and retire the series I bonds aggregating \$30,000 now held by the North Dakota Workmen's Compensation Bureau, together with interest on such bonds up to May 1, 1942, and that the balance of said \$39,000 so to be paid by the North Dakota Workmen's Compensation Bureau for said Series I-B bonds shall be utilized by the said State Water Conservation Commission to reimburse the North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation for moneys advanced by said North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation to said State Water Conservation Commission pursuant to the above mentioned arrangement between them, and expended by the Commission to defray the cost of construction of the said irrigation system and facilities of the Lewis and Clark District.

Judge Christianson then presented the following resolution for the Commission's adoption. A motion was made by Commissioner Dahl and seconded by Commissioner Simons that the resolution be adopted by the Commission. Roll was called with Vice-Chairman Holt, Commissioners Simons, Thompson and Dahl voting aye. Governor Moses absent, Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District issued its bonds in the sum of \$150,000.00 bearing interest at the rate of 6% per annum to pay for the construction of the irrigation system and facilities in said Irrigation District, which said bonds were received by the State Water Conservation Commission in connection with the arrangements existing between the State Water Conservation Commission and the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District for the construction of said Irrigation system;

AND WHEREAS, said bonds bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum, and the principal of each of such bonds was made payable on the first day of July in the several years in which they are payable; and interest was made payable on the first day of July; and whereas in the financing arrangements that have been made by the State Water Conservation Commission interest has been, and will be, paid only at the rate of 3% per annum;

AND WHEREAS, under the laws of this state, irrigation assessments are payable and collected at the same time real estate taxes are collected, and therefore the date of payments of interest and principal of said bonds of the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District does not conform to the time when taxes are collected under our laws, and it therefore seems desirable that the rate of interest on such bonds should be reduced to conform to the rate of interest payable for financing and also that the date of interest and maturity payments of such bonds should be changed to conform to the dates when the assessments ordinarily will be collected under our laws;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the State Water Conservation Commission enter into an agreement with the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District whereby the interest on the Irrigation District bonds from and after April 12, 1942, be reduced to 3% per annum, and also that interest payments on such bonds be made payable annually on the 12th day of April of each year commencing with April 12, 1943;

Also that the maturity of the principal of said Irrigation District bonds be as follows:

That the maturity date of Bonds No. 223 to 232, inclusive, be fixed so that two of such Bonds shall mature on or before the twelfth day of April of each year from 1944 to 1948, inclusive:

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That the maturity date of Bonds No. 233 to 252 inclusive, be fixed so that four of such Bonds shall mature on or before the twelfth day of April of each year from 1949 to 1953, inclusive; and

That the maturity date of Bonds No. 253 to 300, inclusive, be fixed so that six of such Bonds shall mature on or before the twelfth day of April of each year from 1954 to 1961, inclusive.

The President and Secretary of the State Water Conservation Commission are authorized to enter into such agreement on behalf of the State Water Conservation Commission, and to execute any and all instruments that may be required.

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Judge Christianson further presented the following resolution. Mr. K. W. Simons made a motion that the resolution be adopted by the Commission, and Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. Roll was called with Vice-Chairman Holt, Commissioners Thompson, Dahl, and Simons voting aye. Governor Moses absent. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the irrigation system and facilities of the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District have been completed, and whereas in the construction of such system, moneys were advanced from time to time by the North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation, and whereas under an arrangement with the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District, the State Water Conservation Commission from time to time has advanced moneys necessary for the operation and maintenance of such irrigation system and facilities, and from time to time money has been advanced by the North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation to reimburse the State Water Conservation Commission for such advances;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Secretary of the State Water Conservation Commission and Commissioner Dahl be, and they are, hereby authorized to make final settlement of all outstanding matters incident to the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District with the governing board of the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District and with the North Dakota Rural Rehabilitation Corporation, to the end that any and all outstanding matters may be closed; and the President and Secretary of the State Water Conservation Commission are authorized to execute any and all instruments that may be necessary to accomplish this purpose.

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Judge Christianson presented a fourth resolution for adoption by the Commission as follows: Motion was made by Commissioner Simons and seconded by Commissioner Dahl that this resolution be adopted. Roll was called with Vice-Chairman Holt, Commissioners Simons, Thompson, and Dahl voting aye. Governor Moses absent. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, in the construction of the irrigation system and facilities for the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District, easements for right-of-way were taken in the name of the State Water Conservation Commission:

AND WHEREAS, the irrigation system and facilities have now been constructed;

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NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the proper officers of the State Water Conservation Commission be, and they hereby are, authorized to convey and transfer to the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District, the said irrigation system, including such easements and all rights, interests and property having any connection with the said irrigation system, and said officers are authorized to execute any or all instruments required to accomplish this purpose.

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After further discussion, it was decided that the State Water Conservation Commission would take no further interest in the Lewis and Clark Project; except to be informed of the financial status of the project by the Irrigation District. Commissioner Simons also felt that the district should be required to get the approval of Mr. Duffy Murry or Mr. Paulson, or both, before making payments.

Mr. Haskins, Soil Conservation Service, Mandan, North Dakota came into the meeting regarding water right request by the Soil Conservation Service. Mr. Haskins stated that the Soil Conservation Service's request for blanket authority to appropriate all unappropriated waters of the Lower Cannonball, was made on request by the Hettinger Soil Conservation District. He further stated that then when a farmer made a request for water right it would be made through and with the approval of the Soil Conservation Service, as well as the State Engineer. He said that the Soil Conservation Service appropriated waters for that purpose mainly, and that hence, even though the Soil Conservation Service was granted a blanket authority to all remaining unappropriated waters, it did not mean that any farmer wanting to use water would be unable to do so, but rather that he must put in his request through the Soil Conservation Service. After lengthy discussion, Vice-Chairman Holt advised Mr. Haskins that the Commission would further consider the Soil Conservation Service's request and advise them later.

Mr. Haskin left the meeting.

Mr. Iver Acker was called into the meeting.

The Cedar River Mutual Aid Corporation situation was discussed in some detail, and it was generally agreed that it would be a better policy to turn this land over to three or four good operators, rather than several poor operators. It was further decided that if possible, Mr. Leonard Orvedahl of the Farm Security Administration should be asked to attend the meetings to be held in that vicinity on April 14th and 15th, 1942.

Judge Christianson left the meeting.

Mr. Wallace Kyes came into the meeting and asked that the Commission give him a rebate on the pump which he had paid approximately \$69.30 on. Inasmuch as he had used the pump such a very short time and had then returned it himself to the Commission he felt he was entitled to a rebate. The Commission was not in favor of this, but informed Mr. Kyes that if he could sell the pump for any amount over the appraised value of \$180.00, he could withhold such amount.

Mr. Kyes left the meeting.

In regard to the matter of the Baldhill Dam and Diversion to Maple Creek, the Secretary was asked to request the Bureau to make surveys.

The Commission were pleased to hear that the field forces of the Bureau of Reclamation would again occupy the office space in the Commission's offices, arriving approximately the 15th of April.

The Commissioners requested that the reports on the Lewis and Clark Projects and the Profit and Loss Report on the Individual Pumping Projects be mailed by the Secretary to each Commissioner.

In regard to setting up conservancy districts it was suggested that the Secretary present at the next meeting a suggested method of operation.

Commissioner Simons and the Secretary presented a verbal report on the Mouse River Hearing to the Commission members.

The Secretary explained the situation on Senator O'Mahoney's Bill, S2378. The Secretary will send copies of this bill and amendments thereto to each Commissioner.

In regard to the proposed legislation to be submitted to the next Legislature, Mr. Acker said that he would draft the proposed laws, and then work with Commissioner Sivert Thompson on such drafts.

Commissioner Simons and the Secretary made a brief verbal report on the Governors' Meeting in Billings, Montana, on March 25, 1942.

Mr. Acker presented to the Commission a suggested resolution which would change a paragraph in trust indenture on Series "F" bonds. The Commission decided to consult Judge Christianson before taking action on the resolution.

Commissioner Thompson and the Secretary made a brief verbal report on the Aberdeen Civic Association held in Aberdeen on February 23rd.


Mr. Acker suggested that the Commission vote to allow only the signature of the Secretary and Chief Engineer of the Water Commission to appear on Satisfaction of Mortgage or on real estate mortgage, simply because it should be unnecessary to bother the Governor with such details. A motion was made by Commissioner Thompson and seconded by Commissioner Simons that the Secretary be authorized to sign "Satisfaction of Mortgage" and "Real Estate Mortgages" on behalf of the Commission. Motion carried, with all concerned voting aye.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 5:15 P.M., to the call of the chair.
