MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Held in the Office of the State Water Conservation Commission Bismarck, North Dakota, June 25, 1949

The members of the State Water Conservation Commission convened at 10:00 o'clock a.m. on Saturday, June 25, 1949, in the Office of the Water Commission in the State Capitol, Bismarck, North Dakota to open bids for the purchase of a dragline to be used by the Department.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 o'clock a.m. by S. W. Thompson, Vice Chairman of the Commission, with Commissioners Dahl, Olson, Tucker and Secretary Walsh all present. Also present at the opening of the meeting were the above-named representatives of Commanies who had submitted bids on the purchase of a dragline by the Commission. The first order of business was the opening of bids on the purchase of a dragline for the use of the Commission. The Secretary opened and read the bids in the presence of the above-named members of the State Water Commission and the representatives of Companies submitting their bids on the purchase of the dragline.

Upon completion of the reading of the bids at 11:40 a.m., all representatives of Companies submitting bids left the meeting.

Commission members, including Commissioners Thompson, Dahl, Olson, Tucker and Secretary Walsh assembled at 1:30 p.m. for a regular meeting of the State Water Conservation Commission.

The Minutes of the June 3, 1949 meeting of the State Water Conservation Commission were reviewed and Commissioner Dahl moved they be approved, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Olson. Upon call of the roll by Vice Chairman Thompson, all Commissioners voted age. Motion carried.

The Financial Statements for the month of June, 1949, were examined by the members of the Commission. Commissioner Tucker recommended they be adopted and filed with a motion to that effect, which was seconded by Commissioner Dahl. Upon call of the roll by the Vice Chairman, all Commissioners voted age. Motion carried.

After some discussion on the "Memorandum of Understanding" between the North Dakota Agricultural College Experiment Station of the North Dakota Agricultural College and the North Dakota State Water Conservation Commission, submitted by Dean H. L. Walster in regard to the soil survey program to be conducted within the Missouri Basin, Commissioner Dahl made the following motion: "I move that the State Water Conservation Commission authorize the Chairman and Secretary of the Commission to sign the Agreement with the North Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station of the North Dakota Agricultural College to match scientific personnel and field expenses supplied by the Division of Soil Survey of the Bureau of Plant Industry, Soils and Agricultural Engineering of the United States Department of Agriculture on the basis of a cooperative agreement between the aforesaid Division of Soil Survey and the North Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station, to be conducted within the Missouri Basin in North Dakota and in areas in North Dakota to be supplied with waters by diversion from the Missouri River; funds to be supplied by the State Water Conservation Commission in the amount of \$30,000 from the 1947 fund No. 11, Post War Projects, and the Chairman and Secretary of the Commission are authorized to make available immediately funds as may be requested by H. L. Walster, Director of the North Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tucker. Upon call of the roll by the Vice Chairman, Commissioners Dahl, Olson, Tucker and Thompson all voted aye. Motion carried.

An opinion of the Attorney General in regard to whether or not Administrative funds appropriated to the State Water Conservation Commission in 1947 for the reconstruction of drains or irrigation may be used to purchase necessary equipment, and whether such unexpended monies may be used for the purpose of erecting buildings to store and maintain equipment owned by the Water Commission, was read and considered by the Commissioners. It was the opinion of the Attorney General that the monies appropriated in 1947 may be used for the purchase of equipment and to acquire building sites and for the erection of buildings.

Secretary Walsh presented the Commissioners with a statement showing drainage fund balances available for reallocation, and a list of counties requesting funds for the next biennium.

A letter from J. C. Paulson, Secretary of the Lewis and Clark Irrigation District, was read, in which the district directors requested the State Water Commission to render financial assistance to the District in the construction of drainage works. Commissioner Dahl made a motion that the State Water Commission allocate \$10,000 to the Lewis & Clark irrigation district from the 1947 drainage fund No. 11, to assist the District in the construction of drainage canals and structures. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tucker. Roll was called by the Vice Chairman, with Commissioners Olson, Tucker, Dahl and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

A letter from H. M. Laughlin, Chairman, Board of County Commissioners, Steele County, was read to the Commissioners, stating that a group of land holders in Steele County were interested in carrying out a large drainage project this year, to be organized as a legal drain, and are requesting financial assistance from the Commission

to defray 40% of the cost of the project. Commissioner Tucker made a motion that the State Water Commission allocate 40% of the cost, or an amount not to exceed \$10,000, from the 1947 drainage fund, No. 9, to apply toward the cost of building the drain, as the State's share in assisting the organization of Steele County farmers with their project. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Olson. Upon call of the roll by the Chairman, Commissioners Dahl, Tucker, Olson and Thompson all voted aye. Motion carried.

The Commissioners considered a request from Mr. Melvin E. Sandy, Treasurer, Sioux Irrigation District, in which he outlined their program of repair work that will need immediate attention on the project, and have submitted an estimate of the cost of doing the work. Commissioner Dahl made a motion that the State Water Conservation Commission allocate \$5,000 from the 1947-1949 drainage fund to the Sioux Irrigation District, McKenzie County, North Dakota, for needed repairs and construction work to be done on the project. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tucker. Upon call of the roll by the Vice Chairman, Commissioners Dahl, Olson, Tucker and Thompson all voted aye. Motion carried.

Commissioner Tucker made a motion that the State Water Commission allocate to the Burlington Project, Ward County, North Dakota, the sum of \$5,000 from the 1947-1949 drainage fund to be used for repair and construction work on the project. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Olson. Roll was called by the Vice Chairman, with Commissioners Olson, Tucker, Dahl and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

The necessary information and maps having been filed in the office of the State Engineer and Proof of Publication of "Notice of Hearing" received on the water right applications of Marion Hitchens, Lamoure; Lawrence Fradet, West Fargo; and Fred Lundeby, Tolna, North Dakota; were brought to the attention of the Commission for their consideration and approval, and the following action was taken:

Commissioner Dahl made the following motion: "I move that the State Water Conservation Commission approve the application of Marion Hitchens, Lamoure, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from the James River, tributary of the Missouri River, for irrigation purposes, subject to prior and existing water rights covering the James River." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tucker. Roll was called by the Vice Chairman, with Commissioners Tucker, Olson, Dahl and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

Commissioner Dahl made the following motion: "I move that the State Water Conservation Commission approve the application of Fred T. Lundeby, Tolna, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from the Sheyenne River, tributary of the Red River, for irrigation purposes, subject to prior and existing water rights covering the Sheyenne River." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tucker. Upon call of the roll by the Chairman, Commissioners Dahl, Tucker, Olson and Thompson all voted aye. Motion carried.

Commissioner Tucker made the following motion: "I move that the State Water Conservation Commission approve the application of Lawrence Fradet, West Fargo, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from the Sheyenne River, tributary of the Red River, for irrigation purposes, subject to prior and existing water rights covering the Sheyenne River." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dahl. Roll was called by the Vice Chairman, with Commissioners Olson, Dahl, Tucker and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

An underground water survey and investigation Agreement between the City of Richardton and the State Water Conservation Commission was submitted to the members of the Commission for their approval. Commissioner Olson made the following motion: "I move that the State Water Conservation Commission approve and authorize the Chairman and Secretary of the Commission to sign the Agreement for an underground water survey and investigation, in cooperation with the U.S. Geological Survey, between the City of Richardton and the State Water Conservation Commission in the amount of \$750.00, to be matched by an equal amount of \$750.00 from the City of Richardton." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tucker. Roll was called by the Vice Chairman, with Commissioners Dahl, Olson, Tucker and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

Secretary Walsh reported to the members of the Commission that farmers' inspection tours will be conducted from Williston to the Lewis and Clark and the Yellowstone Irrigation Project, from Divide and Bottineau Counties on July 12, from Burke County on July 13, from Renville County on July 14, and from Ward and McHenry Counties on July 15, the tour to start from Williston each day at 9:00 o'clock a.m., a picnic dinner to be held at a park near Fairview, Montana. The Commission recommended that Einar Dahl and Earle Tucker represent the Commission on these inspection tours, if convenient.

Mr. H. M. Erskine, District Engineer, U. S. Geological Survey, Bismarck, entered the meeting at 1:30 p.m. He explained the program of the U. S. Geological Survey in North Dakota, stating their work is the collection and assembling of data and making measurements covering flow of streams. This is done by the operation of stream gaging stations, obtaining a continuous record of flows from day to day, which is then put into usable form for publication, such as the U. S. Geological Survey water supply booklets, Biennial Report of the State Water Conservation Commission and for Federal reports. The program for the State as a whole involves approximately 70 gaging stations, which are financed in cooperation with other agencies, including the Corps of Engineers at Fort Peck and Garrison Dam, the Bureau of Reclamation and the Department of the Interior, and the State Department. Commissioner Thompson stated that it was necessary for the State Water Commission to have knowledge of where these stream gaging stations are located, as the Commission is constantly called upon to allocate waters. Mr. Erskine reported that the greater majority of work is being done on non-recording gages and the record now depends on the honesty and reliability of the person to read the gages everyday. However, the stations are gradually being converted from non-recording to automatic recording stations.

Commissioner Olson made the following motion: "I make a motion that the State Water Conservation Commission authorize the Secretary to enter into a contract with the Department of the Interior, U. S. Geological Survey, for a cooperative agreement for Investigation of Water Resources in continuation of the existing program, from July 1, 1949 to June 30, 1950, in the amount of \$10,000, to be matched equally with Federal funds." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dahl. Upon call of the roll by Vice Chairman Thompson, Commissioners Dahl, Tucker, Olson and Thompson all voted aye. Motion carried.

The Cooperative Agreement between the U. S. Geological Survey and the State Water Conservation Commission for Investigation of Water Resources in connection with the ground water program in North Dakota for the next biennium was acted upon by the Commission as follows:

Commissioner Tucker made the following motion: "I move that the State Water Conservation Commission authorize the Secretary to enter into a contract with the Department of the Interior, U.S. Geological Survey for a cooperative agreement for the Investigation of Water Resources from July 1, 1949 to June 30, 1951, in the amount of \$30,000, to be matched equally with Federal funds." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dahl. Roll was called by the Vice Chairman, with Commissioners Dahl, Olson, Tucker and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

The Chairman and Secretary were also authorized, by the Commission, to enter into and sign an agreement with the U. S. Department of the Interior, Geological Survey, Washington, D. C., for a cooperative agreement for continuation of cooperative topographic surveys in the State of North Dakota for the period July 1, 1949 through June 30, 1950, providing for a State contribution in the amount of \$15,000 to match a Federal contribution in similar amount.

A "Resolution" from the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo, North Dakota, requesting the State Water Conservation Commission "to allocate and make available to the Board of Drain Commissioners of Cass County, North Dakota, or to the Board of County Commissioners of said County, for the purpose of constructing a drain for the drainage and diversion of waters from the Sheyenne River into the Red River, such monies as the said State Water Conservation Commission has available from funds appropriated for drain construction or reconstruction," was acted upon by the Commission.

Mr. Olson made the following motion: "I move that we allocate from the 1947 drainage fund \$20,000 for the purpose of assisting in the construction of drains in Cass County, North Dakota, such funds to be expended in accordance with our practice of assisting with the construction and reconstruction of drains." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tucker. Roll was called by the Chairman, with Commissioners Dahl, Tucker, Olson and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

The Commissioners examined a memorandum and estimate of cost for repairs to the Berger Dam, Barnes County. The State Water Commission is willing to share in the cost, providing the State Game and Fish Department approve the project. Commissioner Olson suggested that the Water Commission pay half the cost and the Game and Fish Department and the County or other agency pay the other half. Mr. Olson was instructed to contact State Game and Fish Commissioner H. R. Morgan before any commitment is made.

Commissioner Olson made the following motion: "I move that we allocate the sum of \$9,500, or so much thereof as may be available out of any funds not heretofore set aside, for the construction and repair of the Berger Dam in Barnes County, North Dakota, providing the project is approved by the State Game and Fish Department and the cost is shared by their Department and local agencies." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Tucker. Roll was called by the Chairman with Commissioners Dahl, Olson, Tucker and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

Commissioner Olson made the following motion: "I move that we allocate 50% of the cost, or so much thereof as may be available out of any funds not heretofore set aside, for the construction and repair of the Faust and Mill Dams, both in Barnes County, North Dakota." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dahl. Roll was called by Vice Chairman Thompson, with Commissioners Dahl, Tucker, Olson and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

The Commission having formally opened the bids of the various parties with respect to the murchase of a dragline, and the bids having been duly considered, it was moved by Commissioner Olson and seconded by Commissioner Tucker, that the lowest bidder being the bid of the Dakota Tractor Company of Fargo for a ½ yard crawler type gasoline propelled power machine, that the bid of said Dakota Tractor and Equipment Company be accepted, in the sum of \$9,712.51, and that the Secretary be authorized to sign the contract on behalf of the Commission. Roll was called by Commissioner Thompson, acting as Chairman, with Commissioners Dahl, Tucker, Olson and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

As there was no further business before the Commission, the meeting adjourned at 4:00 o'clock p.m.
