STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION Minutes of Meeting Held in Office of State Water Commission in Bismarck, North Dakota July 22, 1953

A special meeting of the North Dakota State Water Conservation Commission was held in the Office of the State Water Conservation Commission in Bismarck, North Dakota, on July 22, 1953, to consider matters concerning the Swan Creek Water Conservation and Flood Control District and other business matters. Those present at the meeting were the following:

MEMBERS OF STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION:

Honorable Norman Brunsdale, Governor and Ex-officio Chairman Curtis Olson, Vice-Chairman, Member from Valley City Math Dahl, Member from Bismarck and Commissioner of Agriculture and Labor Earle F. Tucker, Member from Bismarck J. J. Walsh, Secretary and Chief Engineer, State Engineer

OTHERS PRESENT:

I. A. Acker, Counsel for the State Water Conservation Commission

The meeting was called to order by Governor Brunsdale at 10:20 o'clock a.m. with Commissioners Olson, M. Dahl, Tucker, Secretary Walsh and Attorney Acker present.

The Commissioners discussed the adoption of a resolution for the changing of the boundary limits of the Swan Creek Water Conservation and Flood Control District. If such a resolution were to be passed, an order stating same, would have to be sent to the U. S. Army Engineers. A resolution giving the necessary assurances to the U. S. Army Engineers was also discussed.

Upon recommendation of Vice-Chairman Olson and Attorney Acker, the Commission took the following action:

RESOLUTION

The following resolution was offered by Commissioner Tucker who moved its adoption which motion was seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl.

WHEREAS, the State Water Conservation Commission has been informed that in the petition, filed with the Commission by the board of County Commissioners of Cass County, North Dakota and by the City Council of Casselton, North Dakota, requesting the establishment of the Swan Creek Water Conservation and Flood Control District, the North Half $(N_2^{\frac{1}{2}})$ of Section Eight (8) Township One Thirty Nine (139), Range Fifty One (51) West, was omitted from the description of the territory which should have been included in the district, and

WHEREAS, it appears that said premises should have been described in the petition and in the order establishing the district;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the order of the State Water Commission creating the Swan Creek Water Conservation and Flood Control District of Cass County, North Dakota, be amended so as to include in the territory embraced within the boundaries of the district the $N\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 8, Township 139, Range 51 West, Cass County, North Dakota, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the chairman and secretary of the Commission are

hereby authorized and directed to execute, for and on behalf of the Commission, an order amending the order creating the Swan Creek Water Conservation and Flood Control District so as to include within the boundaries of the district the premises herein described.

Upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, Commissioners Math Dahl, Curtis Olson, Earle F. Tucker and Governor Brunsdale all voted aye. Motion carried.

The following resolution was also accepted to be sent to the U.S. Army Engineers giving them the necessary assurances.

RESOLUTION

Commissioner Curtis Olson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption which motion was seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl.

WHEREAS, a project for the improvement of Swan Creek in and near the City of Casselton in Cass County, North Dakota, for flood control is proposed for construction by the Corps of U. S. Army Engineers under the provisions of Section 205 of Public Law 858, 80th Congress, 2nd Session, at an estimated cost of \$195,000.00 of which amount the United States is by Act of Congress authorized to contribute \$150,000.00, and

WHEREAS, the Corps of U. S. Army Engineers will undertake the construction of the project provided assurances are furnished that local interests will provide necessary rights-of-way; hold and save the United States free from damages due to the construction and subsequent maintenance of the project; make at their own expense all alternations to utilities, highways and highway bridges, including approaches; maintain the channel improvements of Swan Creek and assume all construction costs in excess of \$150,000.00, and

WHEREAS, the State Water Conservation Commission has been requested to furnish to the secretary of the army the following assurances:

(a) That all lands, easements, rights-of-way, and spoil disposal areas necessary for the construction and subsequent maintenance of the project will be provided when and as required; (b) That the United States will be held harmless and free from all damages due to construction and subsequent maintenance of the project; (c) That the project will be maintained in accordance with the regulations prescribed by the secretary of the army; (d) That all necessary changes to utilities, roads, highways and highway bridges, including approaches; and that all construction costs in excess of \$150,000.00 will be provided and made available to the district engineer prior to the initiation of construction; (e) That all additional costs to the United States (estimated at \$5,000) of the channel alignment changes proposed by local interests, if such change is incorporated into the project, will be paid, and that such funds will be made available to the district engineer prior to the initiation of construction, and

WHEREAS, the State Water Conservation Commission has been given assurances by Swan Creek Water Conservation and Flood Control District of Cass County, by the City of Casselton and by Cass County, that the proposed project for the improvement of Swan Creek will be constructed and maintained without cost to or assumption of liability by the Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Commission, under the provisions of Section 61-0214 of the 1949 Supplement to the North Dakota Revised Code of 1943, has the power, authority and general jurisdiction:

"C to control and regulate the flow of the streams of the State to minimize the damage of flood water;

"E to improve the channels of the streams for more efficient transportation of the available water of the streams.

"7 to cooperate with the United States and any department, agency or officer thereof in planning establishment of dams, reservoirs, diversion and distributing canals for the utilization of the waters of the State for domestic and municipal needs, irrigation, flood control, water conservation, generation of electric power and for mining, agricultural and manufacturing purposes; and in this connection the State Water Conservation Commission is -- authorized, within the limitations prescribed by law to acquire, convey, contribute or grant to the United States -- real and personal property, including land and easements for diversion and distribution canals";

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the State Water Conservation Commission, an agency and body corporate of the State of North Dakota, does hereby assure the Secretary of the U.S. Army: (1) that all lands, easements, rights-of-way and spoil areas necessary for the construction and subsequent maintenance of the Swan Creek Flood Control project in Cass County, North Dakota will be provided without cost to the United States; (2) that the United States will be held harmless and free from all damages due to construction and subsequent maintenance of the project; (3) that the project will be maintained in accordance with the regulation prescribed by the Secretary of the Army; (4) that all necessary changes to utilities, roads, highways and highway bridges, including approaches will be made, and that all construction costs in excess of \$150,000.00 will be provided and made available to the District Engineer of the Corps of U. S. Engineers, prior to the initiation of construction; (5) that all additional costs to the United States (estimated at \$5,000) of the channel alignment changes proposed by local interests, if such change is incorporated into the project, will be paid, and that such funds will be made available to the district engineer prior to the initiation of construction.

Upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, Commissioners Math Dahl, Curtis Olson, Earle F. Tucker and Governor Brunsdale all voted aye. Motion carried.

Attorney Acker left the meeting at 10:40 o'clock a.m.

A letter from Gerald FitzGerald, Chief Topographic Engineer, Washington, D. C. to Secretary Walsh was read by Governor Brunsdale asking for continuation of cooperative topographic surveys in the State of North Dakota. A motion was made by Commissioner Earle Tucker and seconded by Commissioner Curtis Olson that the Cooperative topographic surveys in the State of North Dakota for the period of July 1, 1953 through June 30, 1955 made with the U. S. Geological Survey for the amount of \$35,000.00 and a federal contribution in similar amount be continued and authorized Secretary Walsh to sign the cooperative agreement. Upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, Commissioners Earle F. Tucker, Math Dahl, Curtis Olson and Governor Brunsdale all voted aye. Motion carried.

Correspondence between Secretary Walsh, Attorney Acker and City Engineer Edward Booth was read to the Commissioners. Mr. Booth is asking for financial assistance from the State Water Conservation Commission to drain the area southeast of Bismarck. It was Mr. Acker's opinion, in his letter to Secretary Walsh, that the area would have to create a drainage district or a water conservation and flood control district before the Commission could cooperate. It was decided that Mr. Booth be invited to attend the next regular meeting of the State Water Conservation Commission to outline the area and explain the problem more thoroughly.

The following telegram sent to Styles Bridges by Governor Brunsdale confirming the pool level of the Garrison Dam reservoir was passed among the Commissioners for their information.

TELEGRAM

North Dakota applauds Senate Appropriations Committee for recommending Garrison Dam appropriation of \$29,000,000 and urges that you fight for it in conference, as House approved amount of \$23,000,000 would wreck schedule for realization of benefits. Also ask that you consider deleting reference to so-called controversy over pool level, as it implies that U. S. Senate believes State of North Dakota has never given decision expected of it. On contrary Governors of this State, designated by Flood Control Act of 1944 as State Spokesman in this matter, have repeatedly stated officially that State has decided on 1850 MSL pool level as being in best interests of State and all its people. Minute minority opposition has been taken into account and overruled in reaching this decision. The State Water Conservation Commission, of which I am Ex-officio Chairman, subscribes unanimously to this message.

A copy of a letter from G. O. Elliott, Chairman of the Stanton Community Club to Fred G. Aandahl was read to the Commissioners. It was an invitation to attend a celebration on August 14 sponsored by the Stanton Civic Club and the Fort Clark Irrigation District. It was decided that the Commissioners would attend the celebration.

Copies of the letters of reappointment of Einar H. Dahl of Watford City and Oscar Lunseth of Grand Forks to the State Water Conservation Commission were shown to the Commissioners. All present signified they approved Governor Brunsdale's action in reappointing these gentlemen for another term, in view of their past experience and service.

A letter written to Mr. Harry Dodd by Mr. Joe Kramer, former employee of the State Water Conservation Commission and a letter written to Mr. Joe Kramer from Attorney Acker were read. Mr. Kramer would like to have recommendations from Secretary Walsh and others to appeal to the August Board at the State Penitentiary for his release. Governor Brunsdale said it was alright to send the recommendations if they wanted to do so for him, but it was very doubtful if he would be released so soon.

Secretary Walsh was given permission for out-of-state travel to go to Reno, Nevada to attend a meeting of the Western State Engineers on August 17, 18, 19 and 20, 1953.

A water-right permit which is being requested by the State Hospital at Jamestown, North Dakota was discussed. It was decided that Attorney Acker would review the application and if the action taken by the State Water Conservation Commission establishing earlier right is sufficient there would be no need for the recent application to be acted on.

The meeting adjourned at 11:20 o'clock a.m.
