# STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION Minutes of Meeting Held in Office of the State Water Commission Bismarck, North Dakota March 1, 1954

A regular meeting of the North Dakota State Water Conservation Commission was called to order on March 1, 1954, at the State Water Conservation Commission office in Bismarck, North Dakota, to consider regular business matters. The following were present:

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 o'clock a.m. by Governor Brunsdale with Commissioners Curtis Olson, Einar H. Dahl, Math Dahl, Secretary J. J. Walsh, and Einar Berge present.

It was moved by Commissioner Math Dahl and seconded by Commissioner Curtis Olson that the Minutes of the meetings of the State Water Conservation Commission held on December 14, 1953, and January 11, 1954, be approved and upon roll call of the Commissioners, all voted aye. Motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Curtis Olson and seconded by Commissioner Einar Dahl that the Financial Statements for January, 1954, be approved and filed in the office of the State Water Conservation Commission. All Commissioners voted aye and the motion carried.

A letter from Governor Brunsdale to Colonel Hille, Garrison District Engineer, Riverdale, North Dakota, a telegram from Governor Brunsdale to Commissioner Oscar Lunseth and a summary of two meetings held in Williston, covering the maximum pool level and protective works for Williston were read by Commissioner Curtis Olson. Governor Brunsdale also left other information concerning the Garrison Dam with Secretary Walsh for the files in the office of the State Water Conservation Commission and for copies for the Commissioners. The Governor stated that there was about 15,700 acres that the Army would have to buy above the 1840 foot level but only 900 acres were cropland.

Secretary J. J. Walsh reported that he had received a telephone call from Mayor Sharp of Jamestown informing him of the hearing on the proposed channel improvements in the Jamestown area to be held on March 2 in the afternoon and evening. A motion was made by Commissioner Math Dahl and seconded by Commissioner Einar Dahl that Commissioner Curtis Olson and Secretary Walsh be authorized to attend the hearing on the proposed channel improvements in Jamestown on behalf of the State Water Conservation Commission. Upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, all Commissioners voted age and the motion carried.

A report of the summary of the dam repair program completed for the 1953 season was presented to the Commissioners for their information.

A letter from Ken McIntyre, Chairman, Rush River Water Conservation and Flood Control District, was read to the Commissioners by Commissioner Curtis Olson. Attached to the letter was a voucher from the Cass County Abstract Company in the amount of \$75.00 for the recording of 74 title owners and a certificate and another voucher from H.L. Chaffee in the amount of \$20.00 for typing easements.

Commissioner Math Dahl made a motion that the State Water Conservation Commission approve for payment the two vouchers from the Rush River Water Conservation and Flood Control District in the amount of \$95.00 for recording title owner names and typing easements. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Curtis Olson and upon roll call Commissioners Einar Dahl, Math Dahl, Curtis Olson and Governor Norman Brunsdale all voted and the motion carried.

Copies of letters from Fred J. Fredrickson concerning flood control problems on the Pipestem River were read to the Commissioners.

Governor Brunsdale read a letter from the Pembina County Auditor stating that in regard to the opinion of the Attorney General as to the State paying 40% of the cost of the project, the members of the County Water Conservation Board of Pembina County did not believe they could qualify for financial assistance on the river straightening projects No. 7 and 8 that were constructed under the supervision of the Soil Conservation Service according to the Attorney General's opinion.

Minutes of the Goose River Watershed Committee meeting held in May-ville, North Dakota, on January 7, 1954, were shown to the Commissioners. Commissioner Curtis Olson reported that he had been at the meeting and that those present were in favor of the general plan as outlined to the Committee by the Soil Conservation Service engineers, to build multiple dams to store flood waters. It would require further investigations and studies before submitting a definite plan report.

An opinion by the Attorney General as to whether the State Water Conservation Commission is legally authorized to render financial assistance to reclamation districts was read to the Commissioners by Commissioner Curtis Olson. Copies are to be made available to members of the Commission.

A copy of the summary of vehicle operations to December 31, 1953, was given to each Commissioner for his information. Secretary Walsh reported that the 1948 Chevrolet Suburban Carryall and the 1949 Chevrolet Sedan Delivery were in poor operating condition and suggested they be traded in for 2 new suburban type cars. Commissioner Curtis Olson made a motion that the Secretary be authorized to get bids for the trade-in of the 1948

Chevrolet Suburban Carryall and the 1949 Chevrolet Sedan Delivery on two new cars and submit to the Commissioners at their next meeting for consideration. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl and upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, Commissioners Einar Dahl, Curtis Olson, Math Dahl, and Governor Brunsdale all voted age. Motion carried.

The Commissioners were shown a statement by the Committee of Water Control and Conservation Association of Fargo, North Dakota. There was no action taken on this matter.

A Notice of Permit Pending by the Service Pipe Line Company, from the U.S. Army Engineers, Garrison District, Riverdale, North Dakota, was read to the Commissioners by Governor Norman Brunsdale.

Commissioner Curtis Olson informed the Commissioners that LeRoy Pease and Bill Sebens of the Greater North Dakota Association had contacted him and requested that he submit a request to the Commission for continued assistance and an allocation of funds to the Greater North Dakota Association for use in assisting them in their program of making and showing pictures on the progress in the water development program as well as in oil, farming, livestock and other activities. Commissioner Math Dahl made a motion that the Commission set aside the sum of \$1,250.00 to use for the purchase of films from the Greater North Dakota Association. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Einar Dahl and upon roll call by Governor Norman Brunsdale, Commissioners Einar Dahl, Curtis Olson, Math Dahl and Governor Brunsdale all voted aye and the motion carried.

Mr. A.J. Dexter, Agricultural Agent, Northern Pacific Railroad, entered the meeting at 11:00 o'clock a.m. It was Mr. Dexter's opinion that the State Water Conservation Commission should contact the Washington Interior office to find out the reason for the delay in construction work on the Oakes Project and the Western Heart District. It was suggested that the Governor write a letter to the Commissioner of Reclamation in Washington to find out the reason for the apparent delay.

There was also some discussion on a letter received from the Assistant Secretary of the Interior, Fred G. Aandahl, saying that the same contract that was offered the original Heart River Project would also be offered the Western Heart River District. The price per acre in the prior contract offered was \$3.75, but now there are reports about the price going up to \$5.20. Mr. Dexter thought that the State Water Conservation Commission should make an inquiry into Washington concerning this matter also.

Commissioner Math Dahl made a motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Curtis Olson that the Governor write to Washington to find out what progress has been made on the Oakes and Heart River Projects and to mention the fact that the State Water Conservation Commission are very much interested in what is going on. All Commissioners voted age and the motion carried.

Mr. Bruce Johnson, District Manger, Bureau of Reclamation, entered the meeting at 11:30 o'clock a.m.

Mr. Johnson explained the 3 plans they now have under consideration for the start of construction on the Garrison Diversion. The present schedule calls for construction to start in 1959, the accelerated schedule calls for construction in 1957, and the intermittent schedule for 1958. Mr. Johnson said that the intermittent schedule was the one that the Bureau favored.

Mr. Johnson also told the Commissioners that he thought the people in the Western Heart River District would probably pay as much as \$2.00 an acre and operate and maintain the project themselves but doubted whether they would agree on a contract to go as high as \$5.00 or \$5.20 an acre.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:30 o'clock p.m., to reconvene at 1:40 o'clock p.m. with Governor Brunsdale, Commissioners Curtis Olson, Math Dahl, Einar Dahl, Secretary J.J. Walsh, Mr. A.J. Dexter, and Bruce Johnson present.

Mr. Johnson wanted to know if the State Water Conservation Commission would consider paying the costs of chartering 2 buses for the members of the Missouri Souris Conservancy and Reclamation District so they would have an opportunity to view the irrigation projects in western North Dakota and eastern Montana.

Commissioner Einar Dahl moved that the State Water Conservation Commission set aside money to pay for the chartering of 2 buses for the members of the newly organized Missouri Souris Conservancy and Reclamation District so they may have an opportunity to observe irrigation practices in western North Dakota and eastern Montana some time this summer. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Curtis Olson and upon roll call by Governor, Commissioners Einar Dahl, Curtis Olson, Math Dahl and Governor Brunsdale all voted age. Motion carried.

Mr. Bruce Johnson left the meeting at 1:55 o'clock p.m.

Mr. Vernon S. Cooper, Assistant Secretary of the State Water Conservation Commission and I.A. Acker, Special Assistant Attorney General for the State Water Conservation Commission entered the meeting at 1:55 o'clock.

A telephone call from the Bismarck Park Board informed the Commission that the land formerly used during the past decade, and known as the Bismarck Irrigated Gardens, is no longer available for this purpose as arrangements are being made by the Bismarck City Park Board to purchase the above land from the North Dakota National Guard.

A letter from the Traill County Auditor concerning Drains #22 and #23 was read to the Commissioners by Assistant Secretary Vernon S. Cooper.

Richard Croy, Chairman; Theodore Sandy, Director; Lawrence Croy, Director; Alfred V. Gullikson, Secretary; and Emil Hartl, a farmer; all of the Sioux Irrigation District entered the meeting at 2:00 o'clock p.m.

The Commission met with the directors of the Sioux Irrigation District to negotiate for the refunding of the bonds of the Sioux Irrigation District presently held by the State Water Conservation Commission and pledged as collateral for the Series J Bond Issue of the Commission. These bonds were issued by the district to cover the costs of constructing the irrigation facilities of the Sioux Irrigation District.

Vernon S. Cooper, Assistant Secretary of the Commission, discussed the bond issue and the proceedings in negotiating for refunding the Sioux Irrigation District Bonds. He stated that the District bonds being held by the Commission at the present were issued in 1939 in the principal amount of \$25,000.00 and were to pay 3% interest payable semi-annually. These bonds were scheduled to be retired beginning July 1, 1949 when \$5,000.00 of the issue became due and each year thereafter the District was to retire \$1,000.00 a year. On July 1, 1949, the District retired \$3,000.00 and on

July 1, 1950 another \$500.00 which have been the only payments made on the principal of the issue by the District. The District has paid all interest due to January 1, 1954.

On June 3, 1949, the State Water Conservation Commission authorized negotiating with the Sioux Irrigation District for the refunding of this bond issue at an interest rate to be not less than 2%. After thorough discussion concerning these refunding negotiations between Commissioner Einar Dahl and the late Judge A.M. Christianson, it was decided that the refunding bond issue should be drawn up for a period of 30 years for \$21,500.00, the balance of the bond issue that remains outstanding, at an interest rate of 21% annually and dated April 1, 1954. It was further decided that the district should be given credit for the difference between the 3% rate and the 21% rate from July 1, 1949 to April 1, 1954 and that the amount so credited be used to pay the costs of the refunding issue with the balance of the interest adjustment to be placed in the District's Sinking Fund for the Refunding Bond issue of the District. Mr. Cooper reviewed a schedule for the refunding bond issue as drawn up by Mr. T.W Sette of the Bank of North Dakota and the requirements the district would have to meet to retire the bond issue and pay the interest as it became due.

Commissioner Einar Dahl offered the following resolution and moved its adoption which motion was seconded by Commissioner Curtis Olson.

WHEREAS, the State Water Conservation Commission is the owner of bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$21,500.00 issued in 1939 by Sioux Irrigation District of McKenzie County, North Dakota, to finance the construction of facilities for the irrigation of lands therein and to purchase equipment required for the establishment of such facilities; and

WHEREAS, bonds which have matured each year since and including 1949, remain unpaid; and

WHEREAS, it appears that it will be to the best interest of Sioux Irrigation District that its bonded indebtedness be refunded, as authorized under Section 61-08 of the Supplement to the Revised Code of 1943, by the issuance of bonds bearing a lower rate of interest than three (3) percent;

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That the State Water Conservation Commission does hereby consent to the refunding of the bonded indebtedness of Sioux Irrigation District as authorized under Chapter 61-08 of the Supplement to the Revised Code of North Dakota for the year 1943
- 2. That in place of the outstanding and unpaid bonds of Sioux Irrigation District, the Commission will accept bonds in denominations of \$500.00 bearing interest at the rate of  $2\frac{1}{4}$  and maturing, serially so that the last installment, or last bond or bonds to fall due, will become payable 30 years from date of issuance in conformity with the following schedule of payments; towit:

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3. That all bonds shall be subject to redemption and pre-payment at any time in whole or in part at par together with accrued interest thereon to date of payment at the option of the district, provided that prior redemption shall be made in the following order, first bond No. 9 then in numerical order Nos., 14, 18, 22, 25, 28, 30, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40 and 42 then remaining outstanding bonds in inverse numerical order.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Commission approve an adjustment in the interest rate on the original bond issue of the district so that said interest rate will be reduced from 3% to  $2\frac{1}{4}$ % effective as of July 1, 1949 and that the difference between the 3% rate and the  $2\frac{1}{4}$ % rate which has been paid by the District between the period July 1, 1949 and April 1, 1954 be credited to the District and be used to pay the cost of refunding this bond issue, the balance to be applied toward the payment of interest due on refunding bonds, said interest adjustment to be computed as follows:

The directors of the Sioux Irrigation District left the meeting at 2:30 o'clock p.m.

The Commission was informed of a request from P.D. Akin, U.S. Geological Survey, for additional funds for matching with Geological Survey funds

for expenditures on ground-water for the fiscal year. It was also brought to their attention that the U.S. Geological Survey had gone into a car pool and that 4 of these cars had been bought with cooperative funds, therefore, belonged partly to the State Water Conservation Commission. Secretary Walsh was to write to Mr. Akin and get more information concerning the car pool. The question of additional funds was left for further discussion at a later meeting.

Commissioner Einar Dahl, made a motion that was seconded by Commissioner Curtis Olson, that the action of the State Engineer in granting the application of Louis Michel, Marmarth, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from the Little Missouri, tributary of the Missouri River, for the irrigation of 73.5 acres of land described as the  $SW_{ij}^{1}NW_{ij}^{1}$ ;  $N_{2}^{1}SW_{ij}^{1}$  of Section 13, Township 131 N., Range 106 W., located in Bowman County, North Dakota, be approved and limited to an annual diversion of 73.5 acre feet of water, subject to all prior and existing water-rights and appropriations covering the Little Missouri River. Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Math Dahl, and seconded by Commissioner Einar Dahl, that the action of the State Engineer in granting the application of the Soil Conservation Service Nursery, Bismarck, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from a well, for the irrigation of 241.2 acres of land described as the NWL; SWL of Section 15, Township 138 N., Range 80 W., located in Burleigh County, North Dakota, be approved and limited to an annual diversion of 241.2 acre feet of water, subject to all prior and existing water-rights and appropriations covering the well. Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Curtis Olson, and seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl, that the action of the State Engineer in granting the application of J. D. Brewster, Timmer, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from the Cannonball River, tributary of the Missouri River, for the irrigation of 208.2 acres of land described as the  $NE_{i_0}^1$ ;  $NE_{i_0}^1SE_{i_0}^1$ ,  $SE_{i_0}^1SE_{i_0}^1$ , of Section 21, Township 133 N., Range 82 W., located in Morton County, North Dakota, be approved and limited to an annual diversion of 160 acre feet of water, subject to all prior and existing waterrights and appropriations covering the Cannonball River. Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Einar Dahl, and seconded by Commissioner Curtis Olson, that the action of the State Engineer in granting the application of Charles O. McCutchan, Medora, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from the Little Missouri River, tributary of the Missouri River, for the irrigation of 98.9 acres of land described as the  $\frac{S_2^1NE_4^1}{4}$ :  $\frac{N_2^1SE_4^1}{2}$  of Section 6, Township 138 N., Range 102 W., located in Billings County, North Dakota, be approved and limited to an annual diversion of 98.9 acre feet of water, subject to all prior and existing water-rights and appropriations covering the Little Missouri River. Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Math Dahl, and seconded by Commissioner Einar Dahl, that the action of the State Engineer in granting the application of John J. Wentz, Napoleon, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from an unnamed lake south and west of Napoleon with shore line in Section 30, Township 135 N., Range 72 W., for the irrigation of 161.3 acres of land described as the  $S_2^2NW_L^4$ ;  $SW_L^4$  of Section 30, Township 135 N., Range 72 W., located in Logan County, North Dakota, be approved and limited

to an annual diversion of 161.3 acre feet of water, subject to all prior and existing water-rights and appropriations covering the unnamed lake south and west of Napoleon with shore line in Section 30, Township 135 N., Range 72 W. Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Curtis Olson, and seconded by Commissioner Einar Dahl, that the action of the State Engineer in granting the application of O.L. Adams, Steele, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from Lake Etta, for the irrigation of 117.5 acres of land described as the W2NW4 of Section 7, Township 138 N., Range 72 W., NE4NE4, S2NE4; SE4NW4; NW4SE4 of Section 12, Township 138 N., Range 73 W., located in Kidder County, North Dakota, be approved and limited to an annual diversion of 117.5 acre feet of water, subject to all prior and existing water-rights and appropriations covering Lake Etta. Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Math Dahl, and seconded by Commissioner Curtis Olson, that the action of the State Engineer in granting the application of John Fergel, Shields, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from the Cannonball River, tributary of the Missouri River, for the irrigation of 90.3 acres of land described as the  $NE_{ij}^{l}$ ;  $SE_{ij}^{l}NW_{ij}^{l}$ ;  $NE_{ij}^{l}SW_{ij}^{l}$ ;  $N_{ij}^{l}SE_{ij}^{l}$  of Section 30, Township 131 N., Range 84 W., located in Grant and Sioux Counties, North Dakota, be approved and limited to an annual diversion of 90.3 acre feet of water, subject to all prior and existing water-rights and appropriations covering the Cannonball River. Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Einar Dahl, and seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl, that the action of the State Engineer in granting the application of Nick Fergel, Shields, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from the Cannonball River, for the irrigation of 81.9 acres of land described as the  $NE_{\psi}^{1}SW_{\psi}^{1}$ ;  $S_{z}^{1}SW_{\psi}^{1}$ ;  $W_{z}^{1}SE_{\psi}^{1}$  of Section 26; and  $NW_{\psi}^{1}NE_{\psi}^{1}$ ;  $N_{z}^{1}NW_{\psi}^{1}$  of Section 35, Township 131 N., Range 85 W., located in Grant and Sioux Counties, North Dakota, be approved and limited to an annual diversion of 81.9 acre feet of water, subject to all prior and existing water-rights and appropriations covering the Cannonball River. Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Curtis Olson, and seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl, that the action of the State Engineer in granting the application of Roy Ekstrom, Dickinson, North Dakota, for a permit to divert and appropriate water from an Intermittent Creek (No Name), tributary of the Green River, for the irrigation of 48.8 acres of land described as the S2SE1 of Section 11, Township 140 N., Range 97 W., located in Stark County, North Dakota, be approved and limited to an annual diversion of 48.8 acre feet of water, subject to all prior and existing water-rights and appropriations covering the Intermittent Creek (No Name). Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.
