STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION Minutes of Meeting Held in Office of State Water Commission in Bismarck, North Dakota March 24, 1955

A regular meeting of the North Dakota State Water Conservation Commission was called to order on March 24, 1955, at the State Water Conservation Commission office in Bismarck, North Dakota, to consider regular business matters. The following were present:

The meeting was called to order at 9:15 o'clock a.m. by Governor Norman Brunsdale with Commissioners Curtis Olson, Earle F. Tucker, Math Dahl and Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen present.

It was moved by Commissioner Earle F. Tucker, and seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl, that the minutes of the meeting held on January 31, 1955, be approved. All Commissioners voted age and the motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Earle F. Tucker, and seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl, that the Financial Statements for January and February, 1955, be approved and filed in the office of the State Water Conservation Commission. All Commissioners voted age and the motion carried.

Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen reported that the city of Drake has requested that a ground water survey be made in their vicinity to determine a source for their municipal water supply. According to Dr. Wilson M. Laird, State Geologist, it would not be possible to undertake a survey at Drake until approximately August 15 in view of the fact that work has been scheduled in the Hettinger and Tappen areas first. The U. S. Geological Survey has requested that the city of Drake and the State Water Conservation Commission each contribute \$750.00 which approximates one-fourth of the estimated cost of the survey.

It was reported to the Commissioners by Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen that the feasibility of the proposed Upper Des Lacs Lake project has been investigated and a report has been prepared. The proposed project, which is the result of a request from interested persons in the Bowbells and Kenmare vicinities, would entail raising Highway #52 in order to raise the level of the lake 5 feet so that it will adequately sustain fishlife. Secretary Hoisveen stated that it appears that the most feasible plan would be to have the State Highway Department install culverts as high as possible and then block off the culverts to see if water can be retained behind the structure. If it is possible to retain the water, outlet works could be constructed at a later date, the approximate cost of which is \$19,000. A considerable quantity of rock and water-bearing sand had been con-

tacted when borings were made in the area of the proposed dam. The State Highway Department has consented to raise the highway approximately two feet.

It was moved by Commissioner Earle F. Tucker, and seconded by Vice-Chairman Curtis Olson, that the State Water Conservation Commission recommend that the State Highway Department raise Highway #52 two feet or more. Upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, all Commissioners voted age and the motion carried.

Vice-Chairman Curtis Olson stated that during a recent visit to the St. Paul office of the Corps of Engineers he discussed the present status of the Swan Creek Flood Control Project with Col. Otto J. Rohde, District Engineer. Colonel Rohde reported that the Corps has been requested to resume plans for the development of the project; however, in view of the fact that funds for construction of the project were revoked, any resumption of work will be dependent upon congressional approval and reallocation of funds. In Colonel Rohde's opinion, it would be very beneficial if the State Water Conservation Commission would forward a request for funds for this project to our congressmen.

Colonel Rohde also informed Vice-Chairman Olson that the Corps of Engineers has approved a dredging project at Enderlin which will clear the Maple River of the beaver dams and other obstructions that have caused the water to become stagnant. The approximate cost of this project is \$10,000. Colonel Rohde requested that the State Water Conservation Commission send a letter requesting this project to the North Dakota congressional delegation.

Bruce Johnson, Projects Manager for the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation, entered the meeting at 9:45 o'clock a.m.

Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen reported that on March 14 Vice-Chairman Curtis Olson, Commissioner Oscar Lunseth, Commissioner Earle F. Tucker and himself met with representatives of the Fargo City Commission in Fargo relative to water-rights on the Red and Sheyenne Rivers and tributaries. Forty-seven water-rights were recommended for passage and three water-rights were refused, one being above the city of Fargo and two being on the Turtle River at Grand Forks. The water-rights on the Turtle River were refused in view of petitions signed by local objectors who stated that they would be deprived of stock water if irrigation was permitted.

Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

Vernon S. Cooper, Assistant Secretary, State Water Conservation Commission, entered the meeting at 9:50 o'clock a.m.

Bruce Johnson, Projects Manager for the Bureau of Reclamation, Bismarck, informed the Commissioners that proposed plans for the activation of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District have been cleared with the regional office. Mr. Johnson stated that he had been directed by regional officials to request the State Water Conservation Commission to organize the Conservancy District as soon after July 1, 1955, as possible. A schedule has been prepared including seven separate items that should be accomplished before the first repayment contract can be made. Included in this schedule are:

- 1. Appointment of the Board of Directors at the July meetings of the Boards of County Commissioners.
- 2. Organizational meeting of the Board of Directors to be held in July.
- 3. Tour of irrigation projects by the Board of Directors during the latter part of July.
- 4. Follow-up meeting of the Board of Directors in August or September.
- 5. Educational activities by the Board of Directors in their counties during the winter months.
- 6. Begin contract negotiations in January, 1956.
- 7. Complete negotiations in May, 1956.

Assistant Secretary Vernon S. Cooper stated that meetings have been arranged with the County Commissioners of the 22 counties during April and May.

Four teams, consisting of members of the State Water Conservation Commission, the Bureau of Reclamation, North Dakota Reclamation Association, Missouri-Souris Projects Association and the Missouri-Souris Conservancy and Reclamation Committee have been designated to appear at the meetings of the Boards of County Commissioners.

It was moved by Vice-Chairman Curtis Olson, and seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl, that the State Water Conservation Commission approve the outlined procedure for activation of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District. Upon a unanimous vote of the Commissioners, the motion carried.

Bruce Johnson, Projects Manager for the Bureau of Reclamation, reported that a meeting was held recently in Dickinson relative to enlargement of the city water supply. The Bureau had proposed the following possible solutions to the problem: 1) Put a 400-acre limitation on irrigation; 2) Buy out all vested rights for irrigation water in 31 years; 3) Raise the elevation of the reservoir in 31 years or as soon as necessary. The people were informed that the cheapest way to increase their water supply would be to limit irrigation to 400 acres and absorb the additional 500 acres reserved for irrigation for their municipal water. According to Mr. Johnson, if irrigation is not limited, the city will have a water shortage within 3 years as the population of Dickinson now exceeds the Bureau's estimate for 1988; however, by limiting irrigation to 400 acres sufficient water should be available to meet the city's needs for 30 to 40 years.

Mr. Johnson left the meeting at 10:15 o'clock a.m.

Vice-Chairman Curtis Olson reported that the Garrison Reservoir Committee is appealing to the State Water Conservation Commission for financial assistance for the payment of expenses for witnesses to appear before Congress to obtain appropriations for water development projects in our state. It was pointed out that the State Water Conservation Commission is not in a position to finance the appearance of any witnesses; however, free transportation will be provided for those appearing at the hearings through the use of the National Guard plane.

It was also suggested by the Garrison Reservoir Committee that the sum of \$500.00 be paid to Mr. E. W. Rising for his services in assisting Fred J. Fredrickson, Planning Coordinator for the State Water Conservation Commission, in Washington, D. C., in preparing statements and arranging for the state representatives to appear at the hearings.

It was moved by Commissioner Earle F. Tucker, and seconded by Vice-Chairman Curtis Olson, that the State Water Conservation Commission employ Mr. E. W. Rising as Assistant Planning Coordinator to assist Fred J. Fredrickson in preparing statements and making arrangements for the delegates who appear before Congress, and that the sum of \$200.00 be paid Mr. Rising for services rendered. Upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, Commissioners Earle F. Tucker, Math Dahl, Curtis Olson and Governor Brunsdale all voted aye. Motion carried.

Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen reported that some of the equipment should be replaced. The following items are needed:

The Commissioners authorized Secretary Hoisveen to obtain informal bids on the above items if that procedure meets with the approval of the Attorney General.

According to Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen, the following informal bids were received on interlock corrugated steel sheet piling: Armco Drainage and Metal Products, Inc. \$7,567.00; Northwestern Sheet and Iron Works, Wahpeton, North Dakota, \$8,303.00.

It was moved by Vice-Chairman Curtis Olson, and seconded by Commissioner Earle F. Tucker, that the State Water Conservation Commission accept the low bid of \$7,567.00 by Armco Drainage and Metal Products, Inc., for interlock corrugated steel sheet piling. Upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, Commissioners Earle F. Tucker, Math Dahl, Curtis Olson and Governor Brunsdale all voted aye. Motion carried.

Assistant Secretary Vernon S. Cooper reported that the State Water Conservation Commission Sinking Funds being held by the Bank of North Dakota as trustee includes:

The State Water Conservation Commission Series J Bond Issue of \$63,000.00 is due in December, 1957. Interest payments of \$1,260.00 on this issue are payable in December of each year. In view of the fact that there will be sufficient income from interest on U. S. Government Securities being held in the Sinking Fund to meet interest payments when they become due, it was recommended that \$2,000.00 of the \$2,301.94 cash be invested in additional U. S. Government Series K - 23/4% Bonds, said securities to be deposited with the Bank of North Dakota as Sinking Fund Trustee for the State Water Conservation Commission Series J Bond Issue.

It was moved by Commissioner Earle F. Tucker, and seconded by Commissioner Math Dahl, that the State Water Conservation Commission invest \$2,000.00 of the Sinking Funds Cash in U. S. Government Series K-23/4% Bonds. Upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, Commissioners Earle F. Tucker, Math Dahl, Curtis Olson and Governor Brunsdale all voted aye. Motion carried.

It was reported to the Commissioners that the Commission has a Booklet Account in the amount of \$1,399.25 which was obtained from the sale of booklets to various schools throughout the state. This money had previously been used to publish the book "Climate and Weather in North Dakota." It was proposed that the money be used for colored publicity maps that could be distributed to schools, county offices, etc. It was the opinion of the Commissioners that these maps should be purchased with funds from the Commission's appropriation if sufficient funds are available and if not, from the Booklet Account.

Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen stated that the repair of Danzig Dam is being held up until federal funds are received; however, the State Game and Fish Department now owns the property on which the dam is located. An estimate of the cost of repairs to this dam has been prepared in the amount of \$17,000.00. The Commis-

sion will pay either one-third or one-half of the cost of repairs, depending on whether the Federal Fish and Wildlife Service will participate.

Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen reported that Commissioner Earle F. Tucker, Assistant State Engineer S. S. Westgate and himself recently appeared before the Burleigh County Commission pertaining to the repair of Olson Dam near Regan. Repair of this dam would include a glory-hole type of spillway, the approximate cost of which is \$26,000.00. The Burleigh County Commission and the State Game and Fish Department have been asked to participate in the repair of this dam.

According to Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen, Sellie Dam on the James River is in need of repair. Secretary Hoisveen stated that the bank at one wing of the dam is eroding as a result of the whirlpool action of the water. A letter from Elmer Severson, Wells County Auditor, was read by Secretary Hoisveen, stating that the County Commissioners would be willing to donate the use of the county road equipment for the repair of this dam; however, some of the people of Hamburg Township in which the dam is located do not wish to participate financially in the repair of this dam. The Game and Fish Department will be contacted relative to participating in the proposed repairs.

Commissioner Earle F. Tucker reported that he and Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen met with officials of the Corps of Engineers and the Belfield City Commission on March 7 in Belfield relative to a flood protection project for that city. The Corps of Engineers will make a survey of the proposed project. It was the opinion of the group that a project for Snagging and Clearing which would come within the \$50,000.00 limitation would be very helpful in preventing future floods. It was also pointed out that the State Water Conservation Commission can now participate in flood protection projects in view of recent legislation which allocated \$200,000 to the Commission for such purposes.

Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen read a letter from Lewis A. Stanley, Oregon State Engineer, requesting the Commission to take action asking Congress to authorize sufficient funds for the U. S. Geological Survey to permit them to match the funds of various western states for investigation of water resources. Secretary Hoisveen was directed to ask the opinion of Fred J. Fredrickson, Planning Coordinator, on this matter before taking further action.

Vice-Chairman Curtis Olson stated that he and Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen attended a meeting of the Missouri Basin Inter-Agency Committee in Omaha, Nebraska, on March 16 relative to reviewing the report which is to be submitted to the Bureau of the Budget. The Committee is requesting comments from the governors pertaining to an outline on state and local participation in federal projects. Secretary Hoisveen will prepare the report for North Dakota.

It was reported to the Commissioners by Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen that a letter has been received from Col. Otto J. Rohde, District Engineer, St. Paul District, Corps of Engineers, stating that recent investigations have revealed that there are eight various obstructions in the channel of the Sheyenne River in the vicinity of Fargo. In view of the fact that the Commission gave assurances that it would maintain the channel below the reservoir, it was Colonel Rohde's opinion that the Commission should clear these obstructions. Action was deferred on this matter for the present time.

The State Game and Fish Department has requested the State Water Conservation Commission to make a survey in the area of Buffalo Lodge Lake in McHenry County relative to the estimated cost of constructing a control structure to maintain the level of the lake. The Game and Fish Department also desires to

know if any additional land will be flooded if the lake level is raised. The survey will be started within a short time.

Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen stated that a resolution has been received from the Sheyenne Valley Rod and Gun Club at Warwick, North Dakota, relative to the establishment of a development farm at Sheyenne, North Dakota. Secretary Hoisveen informed this organization that the Commission has already forwarded a resolution to Congress relative to this matter.

A petition from Henry Fluevog and other resident landowners requesting that a survey be made in the vicinity of Barton, North Dakota, relative to a drainage problem was presented to the Commissioners by Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen. A survey will be made in this area to determine the cause of the drainage problem.

Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen stated that a group of farmers to the east of the Lake Alice area have expressed a desire to form a water conservation and flood control district; however, they do not want to include the Lake Alice-Lake Irvine area in the proposed district. Secretary Hoisveen and S. S. Westgate, Assistant State Engineer, will attend a meeting in Starkweather on March 28 pursuant to the formation of this district.

The Commissioners were informed by Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen that the survey of Lake Metigoshe has been hampered by bad weather. It is hoped that work on this survey can be completed by the first of April. Secretary Hoisveen suggested that it would be desirable to hold a Commission meeting in that area at some future date with interested Canadian officials.

According to Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen, the Wildwood Lake survey has been completed, as has the design. The project appears to be quite feasible. Secretary Hoisveen stated that the proposed plans will be explained to interested people at a meeting in the near future.

Secretary Milo W. Hoisveen reported that the Corps of Engineers is investigating a flood protection project for the city of Linton. Secretary Hoisveen stated that this project could involve the construction of a dam on Beaver Creek. The city of Linton has expressed a desire for financial assistance from the State Water Conservation Commission.

It was brought to the attention of the Commissioners that a letter has been received from F. M. Clinton, Regional Director of the Bureau of Reclamation, containing some pertinent information relative to the 1850 Garrison pool level.

The meeting adjourned at 12:15 o'clock p.m.
