MINUTES NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION Held in the G.P. Hotel Bismarck, North Dakota February 11, 1969

MEMBERS PRESENT:

Richard P. Gallagher, Vice Chairman, Mandan Russell Dushinske, Member from Devils Lake Arne Dahl, Commissioner, Department of Agriculture, Bismarck Milo W. Hoisveen, State Engineer, Chief Engineer and Secretary, State Water Commission, Bismarck

Others Present:

John Rouzie, Bowman Al Grindberg, Assistant Chief Engineer, State Water Commission , Bismarck Jim Schulz, Assistant Secretary, State Water Commission, Bismarck

The Commission meeting opened at 10:15 a.m. with Commissioners Gallagher, Dushinske and Dahl, and Secretary Hoisveen present Vice Chairman Gallagher presided.

MINUTES OF DECEMBER 17, 1968 **APPROVED**

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the minutes be approved as circulated.

JIM SCHULZ

Secretary Hoisveen stated that this would be the last meeting to be attended by Jim Schulz, as he was now a Certified Public Accountant and had resigned effective March 1, 1969 to enter business on his own. Secretary Hoisveen commended Jim for his services to the Commission and the excellent work he had

done; and reported that Matt Emerson had been appointed Assistant Secretary. Commissioner Gallagher asked Schulz if he was resigning due to dissatisfaction with the Commission or because of anything adverse that might have occurred. Schulz stated that he was not leaving for such reasons and was satisfied with his position but felt a desire to

Commissioner Gallagher further stated that Schulz should be retained as a consultant so that the transition would take place without confusion. Commissioner Gallagher stated that he was sure the Commission could come up with a figure saitsfactory to all concerned by the next meeting.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR DECEMBER 1968 and JANUARY 1969 APPROVED

enter private practice.

Jim Schulz reviewed the financial statement. It was moved by Commissioner Dahl, seconded by Commission Dushinske and carried that the financial statements for December 1968

and January 1969 be approved.

BOWMAN COUNTY WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT - BOWMAN-HALEY DAM (#216)

Mr. John Rouzie of Bowman appeared on behalf of the Bowman County Water Management District requesting that the Water

Commission aid in meeting its share of the Construction costs of Bowman-Haley Dam. Mr. Rouzie explained what procedure the Water Management District was following in its efforts to collect funds for the payment of the construction of Bowman-Haley Dam. He indicated that the contract with the Corps of Engineers calls for the eventual payment of \$737,000 on the part of the local entities. Several communities, such as Scranton, Reeder, Bowman and the Bowman County Water Management District, were making contributions at present. They have seven years before they will have to pay for the dam. No funds have been available to pipe the water to the various communities who anticipate the use of the reservoir as a municipal water supply. He stated that the pipeline and treatment plant would cost \$1,600,000 and no money would be requested from the Water Commission for this system. Commissioner Gallagher stated that when the Commission gave the first \$50,000 it committed itself to give an additional amount. The Commission's contribution to Bowman-Haley was less than had been contributed to other counties for similar projects. The Commission was going to build up a continuing fund but this type of fund was not approved by the Legislature. The failure has not been on the part of the Water Management District but on the Commission because of the failure of the Legislature to recognize the need for this legislation. The Commission should be paying \$50,000 each year until the sum of \$300,000 has been paid. It was further opined that the sales tax paid to the State usually exceeds the State's participation. The Commission should agree that it will pay \$50,000 a year until the Commission has contributed \$300,000. The Commission discussed the Bowman-Haley project and the Commission's responsibility. The Commission further indicated that several outstanding projects, such as Pembilier Dam, should be afforded the same consideration in view of their value to the State. Mr. Rouzie stated that the dam's use was far beyond the district's expectation. He was commendatory to the Commission for its efforts in assisting to get this project off the ground.

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the Commission approves the payment of \$50,000 from the contract fund for Bowman-Haley Dam, the money is committed to the Commission's share of the construction costs and not to operation and maintenance.

Mr. Rouzie extended an invitation to the

Commission to hold a meeting in Bowman.

SPRING FLOODING - 1969

Secretary Hoisveen reported on the potential flooding in North Dakota. The

Weather Bureau and the Corps of Engineers, St. Paul District, stated that a potential flood now exists in the Wahpeton and Fargo areas, which could reach the proportions of the 1950 flood. The Corps of Engineers has been attempting to keep the water in the reservoirs in the potential flood areas as low as possible. There is a possibility of flooding in the Mandan area inasmuch as the new levee system has never been tested. The Commission has ordered 70,000 sand bags. The cities in the flood area have been alerted to the situation. The Commission discussed the possibility of assistance from the OEP. Secretary Hoisveen stated that the OEP will assist on any amount of damages totalling over \$350,000 in the State.

PEMBINA, CITY OF -State Museum (#1444)

Secretary Hoisveen stated that a study had been made relative to protecting the State Museum located in the City of Pembina from flooding. The museum is under the supervision of the State Historical Society. The Scoiety does not have the funds to provide the needed protection and the city of Pembina is requesting assistance from the Water Commission. The total construction costs are \$11,770. Secretary Hoisveen recommended that the Commission pay the total cost of construction in view of the many artifacts that date back to the year 1798 when the Selkirk expedition settled in the Pembina area.

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the Commission approves the expenditure of \$11,700 for the construction of a dike to protect the State Museum from flooding.

LINTON FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT (#558)

Secretary Hoisveen reported that at a previous meeting the Commission had approved participation in the Linton

Flood Control project to the extent of \$7,500. The Corps of Engineers is requesting the usual assurances from the Commission. A resolution has been received from the City of Linton relative to assurances that the city gives to the Commission.

It was moved by Commissioner Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Dushinske and carried that the Commission accept the resolution and authorizes the Secretary to enter into an agreement with the Corps of Engineers, and in turn get assurances from the City of Linton.

PEMBINA COUNTY DRAIN #67D (#1139)

Pembina County Drain #67D is a legal drain in Pembina County in which the Commission has been asked to assist

in the cost of improving this drain. The Commission's participation would be \$7,023. The total cost approximates \$20,583.

TRAILL COUNTY DRAIN #43

The original estimate for Drain #43 was \$12,714 as the Commission's share. The actual cost of the Commission's share

of this drain now totals \$14,360.39. The Drain Board is requesting the Commission's participation in this drain to the extent of \$14,360.39.

TRAILL COUNTY DRAIN #45 (#1475)

Traill County Drain Board is requesting that the Commission's 40% participation be increased to \$14,348.75 from

\$11,449.60.

GRAND FORKS COUNTY DRAIN #3 (#1107)

A request has been received from the Grand Forks Drain Board for participation in two drop structures.

The Commission's 40% share would be \$2,530.21.

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the Commission approves the expenditures as designated above for the four drains.

NEWS RELEASES TO LOCAL NEWSPAPERS

DAM SITE INVESTIGATIONS Adams County (#1263) Cottonwood Lake (#1514) Oliver County (#1295) McLean County (#1290) It was suggested that the local entities be supplied with news releases concerning projects in their areas.

Several requests for dam surveys have been made. A deposit of \$200 is requested by the Water Commission prior to making the surveys. After the survey has been made the Commission prepares a cost estimate for determining cost participation. If

the legal entity decides to go ahead with the dam the deposit is applied against the cost of the construction of the dam.

It was moved by Commissioner Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Dushinske and carried that the Commission authorizes the surveys.

PARK AND SHEYENNE RIVERS -SNAGGING AND CLEARING (#662 and #568) A letter has been received from the Corps of Engineers concerning the snagging and clearing of the Park and Sheyenne Rivers. The Corps requests that "any future

channel improvements or alterations should be submitted to this office for approval"

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the report of the District Engineer, Corps of Engineers, be filed.

STATE AUDITOR'S REPORT from July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968.

The report of the State Auditor for the period from July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 was reviewed by the Commission.

It was moved by Commissioner Dahl, seconded by Commissioner Dushinske and carried that the report of the State Auditor be accepted.

LOWHEAD DAM - RED RIVER (#1479)

Al Grindberg, Assistant Chief Engineer, stated that the State Health Department and the Water Commission had conferred

relative to the possibility of a lowhead dam north of Fargo, which would improve the quality of water during the winter months. It would allow the water to come out from under the ice and pick up oxygen. He explained where the proposed dam would be built and the advantages of such a dam. It was indicated that this dam, if constructed, could serve several other major purposes. A 17.0 foot high spillway would back 11.0 feet of water to the proposed plant site intake of the Holly Sugar Beet Plant. It would also back 5.0 feet of water into the city of Fargo. This, in effect, might eliminate the need for an expensive diversion project above that city. Added studies will be required to determine the effect of the Fargo-Moorhead sewage releases into the resultin reservoir.

WATER RIGHTS #1615

The water right of the city of Sheyenne was deferred pending further investigation.

#1616-1620

Secretary Hoisveen presented five water permits to the Commission for considera-

tion. It was the recommendation of the State Engineer that these water permits be approved.

> It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the conditional permits be approved, subject to such conditions as indicated on the permit. (See Appendix A)

JIM SCHULZ

It was moved by Commissioner Dushinske, seconded by Commissioner Dahl and carried that the Secretary prepare a resolution commending Mr. Schulz for his services to the Commission. (See Appendix B)

HENRY STEINBERGER DAY

Commissioner Dahl recommended that a Henry Steinberger day be established

whereby the State Water Commission, the North Dakota Water Users and the conservation districts could pay homage to Mr. Steinberger for his many years of devotion to the State of North Dakota in the field of water. Secretary Hoisveen stated that he would take this up with the proper organizations.

STATE WATER COMMISSION **LEGISLATION**

Al Grindberg reviewed legislation before the Legislature as it pertained to the Water Commission.

The meeting adjourned at 12:30 p.m.
