### MINUTES

## North Dakota State Water Commission Meeting Held In Community Building LaMoure, North Dakota

August 16, 1977

The North Dakota State Water Commission held a meeting on August 16, 1977, in the Community Building, LaMoure, North Dakota. Vice-Chairman, Richard Gallagher, called the meeting to order at 9:20 a.m., and requested Secretary Vernon Fahy to present the agenda.

Proceedings of this meeting were tape recorded to assist in compilation of the minutes.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES Secretary Fahy presented the July 8, 1977 OF JULY 8, 1977 MEETING -Commission meeting minutes as circulated APPROVED prior to this meeting. It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Gray, and carried, that the July 8, 1977 minutes be approved as presented and distributed. REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL Secretary Fahy presented a request for PARTICIPATION IN CONSTRUCTION financial participation in construction OF INDIAN CREEK DAM of Indian Creek Dam in Hettinger County. HETTINGER COUNTY The proposed dam for recreation will be (SWC Project No. 1556) located near Regent. The request is for \$90,000 and with other participants, the proposed shares are as follows: (1 1) 4000 000

Secretary Fahy noted that the dam was previously authorized by the Commission in September, 1973, but land acquisition problems encountered by the State Game and Fish Department held up the project.

> It was moved by Commissioner Just and seconded by Commissioner Kramer that the Commission participate in the amount of \$90,000, contingent upon funds available. All members voted aye on the motion; the motion carried.

ROCKY RUN CREEK WATERSHED -<br/>EDDY, FOSTER AND WELLS COUNTIES<br/>(SWC Project No. 1633)Secretary Fahy presented a request from<br/>the Wells County Water Management District<br/>for financial participation to study the<br/>upper portion of the watershed, located<br/>in Wells County. The study would determine watershed improvements needed in

Wells County, which would contribute to completion of an overall flood control project for the entire watershed in three counties.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Lanz, and carried, that the Commission participate financially in the amount of \$5,000, contingent upon the availability of funds.

CONTINUED DISCUSSION OF THE NEED AND FEASIBILITY OF LIMITATIONS ON THE ISSUANCE OF WATER PERMITS FOR IRRIGATION PURPOSES (SWC Project No. 1400)

Secretary Fahy opened a continued discussion on irrigation acreage limitation and noted that at previous meeting discussions two options were under consideration. Option A was a direct limitation of irrigation acreage for any one individual and Option B was a

combination initial acreage limitation with a time limit after which additional acreage could be granted. He further pointed out that a previous meeting's proceedings were transcribed, but only new information presented today would be transcribed. Testimony was presented as follows:

Alex Johnson, LaMoure - testified in favor of limitations. Mr. Johnson cited present water shortage in other states' irrigation areas and water supply needed for future use. After questioning, he proposed 320 acres of irrigation per family or farm unit.

Don Brandenburg, Edgeley - testified against limitations. Mr. Brandenburg noted the precautions now taken, the efficient use made of water and the present Commission evaluation of aquifers.

Bernard Vculek, Crete - testified against limitations. Mr. Vculek stated that he was testifying as a member of the James Valley Irrigation Association for Marvin Werner, President. His Association represents 50 farms, farming 65,000 acres of land of which approximately 16,000 acres are irrigated. He noted the present practice of maximum use without misuse of the aquifers, citing the Commission's monitoring program.

Arlee Hanson, LaMoure County Commissioner, Litchville - testified for limitations. Mr. Hanson stated his concerns were centered around orderly development through limitation and assured future water supplies. He spoke of further studies in soil compatibility before water is used. He referred to the State Farmers Union resolution concerning limitations. Upon questioning, he stated that speculation in land had taken place.

David Locken, Oakes - testified against limitations. His testimony not in favor of limitations was based upon the present appropriations process now being used by the Commission and the wellmanaged program in granting permits. He referred to the threat of speculation and stated that many do not know of irrigation potential until after land is purchased. He suggested surveys of irrigation farmers and financial supporters to learn the facts about irrigation operations and to publicize the results of county ground-water surveys to educate the people. He also suggested that more time be allowed to develop a permit. Under questions, he suggested 10 years to develop a project.

Mary Hanson, Ludden - testified against limitations. Mrs. Hanson's testimony was about a wife and mother as related to her husband's dryland farm operation moving to an irrigated farm. She cited the improved quality of their farmlife in raising three sons, plus providing employment and homes for two families hired to help them.

Rockford Johnson, Oakes - testified against limitations. Mr. Johnson stated his needs for expansion to provide potatoes to large grocery firms, and the need to rotate potato acreage.

Thomas Heimbuch, Oakes - testified against limitations. Mr. Heimbuch disputed the speculation theory because of costs in developing irrigation. He cited the costs encountered in price of dry land, clearing, leveling and irrigation development. He further stated that it would take five years to become a proficient irrigator.

Allen Hansen, Ludden - testified against limitations. Mr. Hansen suggested a "go-slow" process of granting permits as an alternative to limitations. He stated that he would favor Option B, if limitations are decided upon.

James Dick, Englevale - testified in favor of limitations. Mr. Dick testified that water use must be considered separately for each community or area, but that water should be held for future use. He suggested a limited number of years use and then evaluation of a permit.

Milo W. Hoisveen, Bismarck, representing the James Valley Irrigation Association - testified against limitations. Mr. Hoisveen cited the practice of limiting acres on federal projects where many operators were able to acquire additional acres by various methods. He suggested the use of a non-speculation clause with water permits and a possible groundwater users policy committee whose membership would include irrigators.

Dale Hvistendal, Oakes - testified against limitations. Mr. Hvistendal questioned the Commission's authority to limit an irrigator as to acreage. He cited his need, as a melon producer, to have increased acreage to meet marketing demands and for crop rotation.

Ernest Scheibe, LaMoure - testified in favor of limitations. Mr. Schiebe testified that limiting acreage would lead to smaller farm units which would be better for the community. He cited the present surplus of farm products as a need to limit irrigation.

Lunch recess and the meeting reconvened at 1:30 p.m. with Commission Kramer presiding.

HEARING ON RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING DRAINAGE IN NORTH DAKOTA

Secretary Fahy introduced Mike Dwyer to conduct a hearing on revised rules and regulations concerning drainage.

Mr. Dwyer stated the revised rules and regulations were a result of legislative action changing the requirement for a permit when a watershed of 80 acres instead of the previous 40 acres are involved in the drainage of water from a pond, slough or lake, or any series thereof. He reviewed, with the use of hand-out materials, the sections of rules and regulations affected.

Russ Dushinske, representing the North Dakota Water Users Association and the North Dakota Water Management Districts Association, testified in favor of the proposal.

Local persons had questions which were referred to the LaMoure County Water Management District.

> It was moved by Commissioner Gray and seconded by Commissioner Lanz that the Rules and Regulations proposed be adopted. The motion carried.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTIONS FROM ND WATER USERS ASSOCIATION AND ND WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICTS ASSOCIATION CONCERNING WATER PERMITS (SWC Project No. 1400) Secretary Fahy called upon Russ Dushinske to present two resolutions regarding irrigation acreage limitations adopted by the North Dakota Water Users Association and the North Dakota Water Management Districts Association. The resolutions

are in opposition to strict limitations and offer several alternatives. (SEE APPENDICES "A" AND "B")

CONSIDERATION OF WATER PERMIT REQUESTS (SWC Project No. 1400) Secretary Fahy presented APPENDIX "C", which represents the water permit agenda, along with his recommendations as State Engineer. Because of a request for delay

by the City of Devils Lake, whose representatives did not attend the meeting, water permit request No. 2661 was recommended to be deleted from final action.

It was moved by Commissioner Lanz, seconded by Commissioner Gray, and carried, that action be deferred on water permit request No. 2661, Darrie Peterson, Warwick, ND.

Milton Lindvig noted that final recommendations on request No. 2890 for a rural water system in Bottineau County was not made prior to the meeting. Because of international concerns, he felt that action should be deferred.

RESOLUTION REGARDING IMPACT STATEMENT FROM THE LOSS OR MODIFICATION OF GARRISON DIVERSION (SWC Project No. 237)

Secretary Fahy presented a resolution adopted by the North Dakota Water Users Association regarding a "negative" impact statement to show economic loss to the State from the loss or modification of Garrison Diversion.

Homer Engelhorn and Bill Bosse, representing the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, testified that their Board approved the resolution and would form a committee to work on the impact study. It was stated that the word "negative" could be deleted. They noted the impact study results would be helpful for future use at Congressional and other hearings. (SEE APPENDIX "D")

RESOLUTION REGARDING RECREATION, FISH AND WILDLIFE OPPORTUNITIES FROM GARRISON DIVERSION (SWC Project No. 237)

Secretary Fahy presented a resolution adopted by the North Dakota Water Users Association regarding re-establishing beneficial recreation and fish and wildlife programs listed in the original

Garrision Diversion Unit plan developed by the National Park Service and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The recommendation was for a task force of state resource agencies acting under the direction of the Natural Resources Council. (SEE APPENDIX "E")

CONSIDERATION OF NEXT STATE WATER COMMISSION MEETING Secretary Fahy read an invitation to hold the next Commission meeting in Walhalla, indicating the exact dates could not be set pending open dates available to Governor-Chairman Link.

It was moved by Commissioner Just, seconded by Commissioner Gray, and carried, that the Commission accept an invitation for the next meeting to be held in Walhalla.

It was noted that the annual meetings of the North Dakota Water Users Association and the North Dakota Water Management Districts Association will be held December 5, 6 and 7, 1977 in Grand Forks. Secretary Fahy noted that Governor Link has accepted an invitation to appear on the program and that he usually calls a Commission meeting during these annual meetings.

REVIEW OF AND RESOLUTION REGARDING WATER RESOURCES COUNCIL WATER RESOURCE POLICY STUDY Murray Sagsveen reviewed Commission staff work and actions regarding the Water Resources Council policy study for National Water Resources Policy. He updated the Commission on options formulated in Washington and

commented on time limits allowed for response. He reported on possible actions to be taken by other states and by the Attorneys General of the western states. Also noted was the extension until October 1, 1977 for responses to the options presented in the policy study papers.

> It was moved by Commissioner Lanz, seconded by Commissioner Gray, and carried, that the Commission adopt Resolution No. 77-8-400 -Resolution Concerning the Water Resources Council Water Resource Policy Study. (SEE APPENDIX "F")

Acting Chairman Kramer commended Mr. Sagsveen for his efforts to keep the Commission advised regarding the study.

OTHER BUSINESS

Hand-out materials were circulated with subsequent brief discussions regarding the following: news articles from the

Billings Gazette; Indian-State Water Resources Management; Bureau of Reclamation policy relative to water marketing for water use along open reaches of Missouri River in North Dakota; and Yellowstone Level "B" Study Report (comments on conclusions of report).

APPRECIATION EXPRESSED Acting Chairman Kramer expressed the Commission's appreciation to the local sponsors for hosting the Commission meeting and related irrigation tour and public meeting.

There being no further business to come before the Commission at this time, the meeting was adjourned at 3:30 p.m.

### APPENDIX "D"

### RESOLUTION

## Negative Impact Statement

- WHEREAS, current proposals by President Carter, given cursory review and endorsement by his field review team, would decimate the Garrison Diversion Unit to less than 25 per cent of its authorized size; and
- WHEREAS, an out-of-court settlement in the Federal Court lawsuit brought by the National Audubon Society against the Department of Interior through Secretary Cecil Andrus has virtually the same objective; and
- WHEREAS, we believe the administration has not taken into account the vast repercussions such project modification would have on the State of North Dakota and the Nation, including denial of contracted water to serve over 190,000 acres of irrigation, 30 municipalities with a population exceeding 250,000, restoration of lakes, stabilized stream flows for rural water systems and other domestic uses, for fish and wildlife and for recreational projects; and
- WHEREAS, the State of North Dakota, its citizens, the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District and the taxpayers of the United States already have made tremendous investments of money, time and effort in the Garrison Diversion program; and
- WHEREAS, slow-downs or halting of construction interrupts the timetable and, through normal infation greatly increases the costs; and
- WHEREAS, each delay in construction postpones the day when the State and Nation will reap the benefits of their investments; and
- WHEREAS, many studies have been completed by researchers and planners, particularly at N. D. State University and the University of North Dakota, in cooperation with the Water Resources Institute, and in state agencies which cover projected benefits from both economic and environmental viewpoints; and
- WHEREAS, a complete compliation of the negative impacts of slow-downs, reductions in project size and alterations that limit its potential should be available to counteract the continuing attacks of project opponents;
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the North Dakota Water Users Association, in regular session at Valley City, North Dakota, this 13th day of July, 1977, does hereby respectfully request the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District to undertake early preparation of a "negative impact" report, in cooperation with university and state agency technicians which would be made available to the Federal Administration, to the U. S. Congress, to the State Administration and agencies, to the North Dakota Legislature and to all persons interested in the early completion of the Garrison Diversion Unit.

### APPENDIX "E"

#### RESOLUTION

Garrison Diversion Recreation, Fish and Wildlife Opportunities

- WHEREAS, the revised plan for mitigation of wetlands losses in construction of the Garrison Diversion Unit apparently is confined to a program to restore drained wetlands in the 25-county Garrison Diversion Conservancy District; and
- WHEREAS, this plan ignores much of the beneficial uses of Missouri River water to restore and stabilize lakes and improve stream flows, all of which is beneficial to fish and wildlife; and
- WHEREAS, pursuit of the revised plan will deny citizens of North Dakota, and visitors, many fine opportunities for much-needed water-oriented recreation areas; and

## WHEREAS, the availability of an assured supply of water holds considerable promise to improve recreation possibilities throughout central and eastern North Dakota; and

- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the North Dakota Water Users Association, in regular session at Valley City, North Dakota, this 13th day of July, 1977, that Governor Arthur A. Link is respectfully requested to establish a task force representing state resources agencies under the direction of the Natural Resources Council to study opportunites for re-establishing beneficial recreation and fish and wildlife programs listed in the original Garrison Diversion Unit plan developed by the National Park Service and the Fish and Wildlife Service; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this study not be confined to the original projects but to consider other possiblities, notably recreation and fish and game management areas, such as the so-called "in-line" lakes along the McClusky Canal.

# **RESOLUTION 77-8-400**

## RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE WATER RESOURCES COUNCIL WATER RESOURCE POLICY STUDY

WHEREAS, President Carter (on May 23, 1977) directed the Office of Management and Budget, the Council on Environmental Quality, and the Water Resources Council to conduct a six month review of the present national water resources policy and to provide him with specific recommendations for policy coordination and comprehensive reform; and

WHEREAS, the issues and possible options were hurredly developed and published in the Federal Register on July 15 and 25, thereby not allowing for adequate preparation of the issues/options therein; and

WHEREAS, the hearings on the Issues/options (July 28-August 5) did not allow time for adequate preparation and critique of the issues/options; and

WHEREAS, the Water Resource Policy Study will not be conducted in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) even though the study is intended to lead toward a "comprehensive reform of water resources policy" which will inevitably be highly controversial and have a significant impact on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the study has a preconceived negative attitude concerning the welldeveloped water laws of the Western States; and

WHEREAS, a review of the issues/options clearly reveals a lack of understanding of the importance of water to the Western States and fails to recognize states' rights in water law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the North Dakota State Water Commission at its meeting held in LaMoure, North Dakota, on August 16, 1977, that it: Supports a continuing review of the water resource policy of the United States, but rejects completely the manner in which the Water Resource Policy Study has been initiated and conducted.

Requests the Federal government to inform the states of the impacts of the study proposals (viz, through NEPA) in order to allow the states adequate opportunity to participate in its development and substantively affect the decision making process that will follow.

Requests the Attorney General to take whatever legal action is appropriate and necessary to preserve the state's sovereign control over its waters.
