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MINUTES

North Dakota State Water Commission Minot, North Dakota

July 24, 1981

The North Dakota State Water Commission held a special meeting in the City Council Chambers at the Minot City Hall, Minot, North Dakota, on July 24, 1981. Governor-Chairman, Allen I. Olson, called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m., and requested Secretary Vernon Fahy to call the roll and present the agenda.

The proceedings of the meeting were recorded to assist in compilation of the minutes.

CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES
OF JULY 6, 1981 MEETING ACTION DEFERRED

Secretary Fahy indicated that the minutes of the July 6, 1981 meeting were in the draft stage, but would be available for consideration at the August 12 meeting.

CONTINUED DISCUSSION RELATIVE TO PROPOSED BURLINGTON DAM AND SOURIS RIVER FLOOD CONTROL EFFORT (SWC Project No. 1408)

State Representative Orlin Hanson explained the layout of the Souris Basin, flooding history, and the potential for cooperation with Canada.

Jack Bone discussed the history of the Minot floods, and the history of the Corps of Engineers study and involvement in alternatives to alleviate the flooding problems.

Commissioner Al Kramer mentioned the water Resource District will have to play the lead role. He also discussed the possibility of a special appropriation from the State Legislature.

Representative Dick Backus explained flood protection for the Souris River Valley in North Dakota while alternative approaches to providing permanent flood protection are investigated. He also discussed the benefits from the Rafferty Dam in Canada.

The Mayor of Minot, Chester Reiten, explained Minot's position on the agreement and future flood control and stated that the City Council of Minot has voted to support the agreement.

 ${\sf Mr.}$ Orlin Backes, President of 4-Dam alternatives.

Mr. Orlin Oium, member of the Board of Directors of Citizens to Save the Valley, and living in the downstream area, stated that this group has gone on record in support of the agreement.

Secretary Fahy read a draft resolution to adopt the resolution, it would endorse the concepts of the attached Memorandum of Understanding and Agreement and would fully support its immediate implementation.

It was moved by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Kramer that the State Water Commission adopt Resolution No. 81-7-410, relating to providing interim flood protection for the Souris River Valley in North Dakota while alternative approaches to providing permanent flood protection are investigated; endorsing the concepts of the agreement; and fully supporting its implementation.

In discussion of the motion, Orlin Backes It was indicated that the plan is for no mitigation during the initial phase

Mr. Orlin Hanson stated that he is in damages following construction.

Secretary Fahy read the role of the hereto as APPENDIX "B".

The question was called on the motion by the Chairman. All members voted aye; motion unanimously carried. SEE APPENDIX "C"

CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSED
RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT EFFORTS
TO RESOLVE FLOOD PROBLEMS AND
RELATED WATER MANAGEMENT
PROBLEMS IN THE RED RIVER WATERSHED
(SWC Project No. 1705)

Secretary Fahy explained the flooding and other water management problems of the Red River watershed. He read a proposed resolution for the Commission's consideration that would urge all of the water resource districts of the Red River Joint Board and their respective county commissioners

to take whatever action is necessary to provide for local funds from mill levies or assessments to ensure that the moneys appropriated by the 1981 Legislature under House Bill 1466 can be expended for flood control projects in the Red River watershed.

It was moved by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Hutton, and unanimously carried, that the State Water Commission adopt Resolution No. 81-7-411. SEE APPENDIX "D"

BOUNDARY CREEK WATERSHED RECREATION AREA (SWC Project No. 1342)

Secretary Fahy stated that the State Water Commission is doing the engineering for the Soil Conservation Service for the recreation areas for Boundary Creek

Watershed - Carbury Dam. This was requested by the Boundary Creek Water Resource District. He indicated that the SCS has requested that the State Water Commission be a project sponsor in order for them to accept the engineering. He noted that no funding would be required of the Water Commission.

It was moved by Commissioner Kramer, seconded by Commissioner Larson, and unanimously carried, that the State Water Commission act as project sponsors to do the engineering work for the recreation areas for Boundary Creek Watershed - Carbury Dam.

STATUS REPORT ON SOUTHWEST PIPELINE PROJECT (SWC Project No. 1736)

Mike Dwyer, Legal Counsel for the State Water Commission, updated the Commission members on the Southwest Pipeline Project.

Mr. Dwyer advised that the firms selected by the State Water Commission for the engineering consulting work had received their certificates of authority from the Board of Registered Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors, but that the Attorney General's opinion had not yet been received. Mr. Dwyer stated that on Monday, July 27, 1981, the State Water Commission staff was going to begin negotiations on the engineering consulting contract, but that the contract would not be executed until after the Attorney General's opinion had been received.

It was moved by Commissioner Schank, seconded by Commissioner Kramer, and unanimously carried, that the meeting adjourn at 12:00 noon.

Vernon Fahy / State Engineer and Secretary RELATING TO PROVIDING INTERIN FLOOD PROTECTION FOR THE SOURIS RIVER VALLEY IN NORTH DAKOTA WITCH ADDICATIVE APPROACHES TO PROVIDING PERHABERY FIXED PROPERTION ARE INVESTIGATED.

GENERAL AGREEMENT

The signators of the Memorandum of Understanding agree that permanent protection from dastructive flooding must be provided the citizens of the Souris Valley in North Dakota. They further agree that, to the extent possible, methods of providing this permanent protection should be acceptable to both those benefitted and those adversely affected by the construction of permanent flood protection Jacilities. As concerns have been expressed that alternative approaches to providing permanent protection may not have been fully explored in the past, the signators agree that the interim flood protection measures described below should be constructed as soon as possible while alternative approaches to permanent protection are cooperatively investigated and, if found feasible, promoted for implementation.

INTERIM PROTECTION

To provide a reasonable level of interim flood protection in the Souris River Valley in North Dakota, the signators concur that alterations to Lake Parling Dam and related facilities should be immediately constructed to create a four-foot vertical rise in the flood control capabilities of that structure. These alterations should include raising the Soo Line Relired and the four roads crossing the flood pool above the maximum operating level of Lake Darling Dam. Permanent leves construction in the rural and urban areas below Lake Darling Dam up to the J. Clar. Salyer Rafuge should be completed as soon as practicably possible. Channelization work should also be initiated on the Scuris River below the boundaries of the Upper Souris Refuge.

INVESTIGATION OF ALTERNATIVES

During the period of construction of the Interim protection features or seven (7) years, whichever period is longer, mutual and cooperative offorts will be made by the signators to investigate elternative approaches to permanent flood protection for the Souris River Valley in North Those approaches will include, but not be limited to, the feasibility of the construction of flood control structures in the Province of Saskatchewan and the possibility of the construction of a series of water retention structures above the Des Lacs River Valley. The investigation of these alternatives is not to be construed as a rejection or diminuation of support for the Burlington Reservoir authorization by the supporters of the Burlington Dan, no does it signify support by other interests for the construction of the Burlington Reservoi:. Ouring the period of investigation, reauthorization of the Burlington Cam will not be supported by the signators to this Memorandum of Understanding. However, in the event that investigations conclusively demonstrate that alternative approaches which diminish the negative impacts of permanent flood protection in North Dakota are feasible and practicable, the signators agree to cooperatively pursue the authorization and construction of those alternative approaches. Alternatives which are feasible and practicable must demonstrate acceptability to affected landowners and be compatible to the planning and development programs of appropriate savernmental entities in the United States and Canada.

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THE ROLE OF THE STATE WATER COMMISSION

ON SOURIS RIVER FLOOD CONTROL

- 1. Support the Memorandum of Understanding containing the plan of phased implementation for Souris River flood control. This should first be done by resolution.
- 2. Support requests for further congressional authorization and appropriation for the construction of the first phase of the interim plan by the Corps of Engineers.
- 3. Support the investigation of alternative methods of providing permanent flood protection for the Souris River Valley. The initial investigations would be done by local interests. Then, once plans are formulated, the State Water Commission could possibly provide technical assistance to determine the feasibility of the plans. Normal procedure is for a local entity, such as a water resource board, to request technical assistance. This assistance would involve preliminary engineering for alternatives.
- 4. Support the advancement of feasible alternative plans to the Corps of Engineers. These alternatives would be possible replacements for Burlington Dam.
- 5. For project features which do not fall under Corps authority, the State Water Commission could support the final design and construction. This could be by technical assistance and financial assistance. For smaller projects, it is possible that contract funds could be used. To do so, the local project sponsors would have to submit a request for cost sharing. The State Water Commission could possibly fund up to 40% following cost sharing policies. For projects beyond normal contract fund capability, a special appropriation request would have to be made to the Legislature.

RESOLUTION NO. 81-7-410

Supporting Memorandum of Understanding On Souris River Flood Control Project -Burlington Dam

WHEREAS, a demonstrated need exists to provide permanent protection from destructive flooding in the Souris River Basin in North Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the Souris River Flood Control Project was authorized by Congress in 1971 to meet that need by the construction of the Burlington Dam and related works; and

WHEREAS, serious concerns have been raised regarding the possibility of methods of providing the required permanent flood protection in combination with a program of total water management in the Souris River Basin; and

WHEREAS, local affected units of government have agreed to a Memorandum of Understanding, the provisions of which, if implemented, would provide interim flood protection to the residents of the Souris River Basin while alternative methods of providing permanent flood protection are investigated; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of the Souris
River Basin that this interim protection be provided as expeditiously as possible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the North Dakota State Water Commission, meeting in special session in Minot, North Dakota, this 24th day of July, 1981, that we do hereby endorse the concepts of the attached Memorandum of Understanding and fully support its immediate implementation.

RESOLUTION NO. 81-7-411

Urging The Water Resource Districts And County Commissioners In Red River Valley To Take Action Required By HB-1466

WHEREAS, the North Dakota State Water Commission is fully supportive of the efforts and activities of the Red River Joint Water Resource Board to resolve the flooding and other water management problems of the Red River watershed; and

WHEREAS, the Red River Joint Water Resource Board is currently reviewing and preparing to implement projects throughout the Red River watershed to resolve flooding and other water management problems for the benefit of all members of the Red River Joint Water Resource Board; and

WHEREAS, to further the implementation of these projects, the 1981
Legislative Assembly enacted House Bill 1466 (1981 S.L., Ch. 44) which
appropriated \$500,000 to the State Water Commission contract fund "for the
purpose of the investigation, development, preliminary engineering analysis,
estimate of costs, and construction of flood control projects and related works
in member districts of the Red River Joint Water Resource Board". However,
the Legislature also provided in House Bill 1466 that the appropriation of
\$500,000, "shall not be expended until provisions for local funds from mill
levies or assessments are made to match funds from this appropriation".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Dakota State Water Commission, meeting in special session this 24th day of July, 1981, hereby urges all of the water resource districts of the Red River Joint Board and their respective county commissioners to take whatever action is necessary to provide for local funds from mill levies or assessments to ensure that the moneys appropriated by the 1981 Legislature under House Bill 1466 can be expended for flood control projects in the Red River watershed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Water Commission pledges its support and cooperation to the Red River Joint Water Resource Board for these most essential efforts to resolve the flooding and related water management problems in the Red River watershed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Governor Allen 1. Olson, as chairman of the State Water Commission, be directed to send this resolution to the chairman of the Red River Joint Board and those water resource districts and their respective county commissioners which have not taken the necessary action to allow the utilization of funds appropriated under House Bill 1466.
